

FOR YOUR PLANNING: A Christmas Tree has been placed in the Mausoleum. The tree is there for you to place an ornament in memory of a loved one buried in Holly Redeemer Cemetery/Mausoleum. Please NO glass ornaments, unbreakable only. We ask that you please be respectful of ornaments place on the tree by families and that they not be removed. Thank you.



BAPTISM/SPONSORSHIP CLASS - Parents and godparents are required to attend one session before the child's baptism date can be confirmed. Sessions are held on the 1st Tuesday of every month at 7:00PM in the Parish Center - 3rd floor. (Adults only - please, no infants or children.) Registration is required. Contact Sr. Nadine 908-756-0633 x118 to register for the class or with any questions.

SPONSOR LETTERS - Canon (Church) Law mandates that a Godparent for Baptism and a Sponsor for Confirmation be an active, Confirmed Catholic. An active Catholic is a parishioner who is registered, attends Mass weekly, contributes to the support of the Church, is in a valid Catholic marriage (an individual married civilly by a judge, mayor, or divorced and remarried without an annulment is not eligible to act as a sponsor) and publicly leads a life compatible with Church teaching. Please note that we can only write Letters of Eligibility for parishioners who meet these criteria.

AED IN CHURCH - An Automated External Defibrillator

(AED) is a portable electronic device that automatically diagnoses the life-threatening cardiac arrhythmias of ventricular fibrillation and ventricular tachycardia in a patient, and is able to treat them through defibrillation allowing the heart to reestablish an effective rhythm. We have purchased & installed an AED in church to assist in emergency medical situations. The AED is door-mounted next to the St. Joseph statue at the front of the church.

THIS IS OUR FAITH

Advent: Jesus in Glory and Majesty

Matthew Kelly of *Dynamic Catholic* in his opening to this year's Best Advent Ever asks, "Have you ever had a Christmas where you felt like you were really prepared? Have you ever had a Christmas where you walked into Christmas Mass and you felt focused and peaceful and ready?

Kelly continues "We prepare for everything we consider important in life, and Advent is the time we prepare for Christmas. For many people, preparing for Christmas includes shopping, baking cookies, wrapping presents, hanging decorations, and much, much more. Often these activities are stressful and chaotic, and they easily become a distraction from what Christmas is really all about."

Last week we discussed that in the Catholic Church, Advent is a period of preparation extending over four Sundays before Christmas. During these first two Advent Sunday liturgies we focus on the Second Coming of Jesus, in glory and majesty, as Final Judge. In the last two Sundays of Advent we focus on the coming of the infant Messiah, born in time and in our hearts.

It is important to focus on the final judgement so that we are prepared for it. This is especially important in our current time when we seem to have lost a sense of sin, and how it separates us from God and neighbor. Because of this spiritual and social blindness, our sin fades into the background, just as the true reason for the season, Jesus, fades into the background, even as we prepare for all the other aspects of Christmas: food, baking, parties, gifts, etc.

In last week's and this week's Gospel passages, Jesus calls on us to be prepared for our Final Judgement, since it is our decisions today that determine our place for all eternity. Jesus does not want us to come-up short on the Last Day! In last week's Gospel. Jesus reminds us of our Final Judgement when He says: "So too, you also must be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come." And, in this week's Gospel, Jesus reminds us of the Final Judgement by saying, "Therefore every tree that does not bear good fruit will be cut down and thrown into the fire."

It is important that we hear and listen to Jesus and be prepared. In doing this we cannot let our hearts be troubled nor get discouraged. We need to remember the lessons from the recent Year of Mercy. Remember, God is merciful and grants us His forgiveness, as long as we repent of our errors and transgressions and show mercy to our neighbors on our journey together.

Advent is about our letting God come to us. The mystery of our faith is that God is not reluctant to enter into an unusual relationship (as with Mary and Joseph) or to be born in the poverty of a makeshift stable. We may be tempted to prepare for Advent by cleaning-up everything first – in effect, saving ourselves first. Our Advent awakening is to accept that we need saving, and having been saved, to accept the love and mercy of our God.

THE JESSE TREE


