

SPONSOR LETTERS - Canon (Church) Law mandates that a Godparent for Baptism and a Sponsor for Confirmation be an active, Confirmed Catholic. An active Catholic is a parishioner who is registered, attends Mass weekly, contributes to the support of the Church, is in a valid Catholic marriage (an individual married civilly by a judge, mayor, or divorced and remarried without an annulment is not eligible to act as a sponsor) and publicly leads a life compatible with Church teaching. Please note that we can only write *Letters of Eligibility* for parishioners who meet these criteria.

THIS IS OUR FAITH *Life*

The Right to Life and the duty to cherish and support the gift of every persons' life: **the unborn**, **the dying**, **the immigrant are all part of the Seamless Catholic Approach to Life!** We are called to respect life from the moment of conception until natural death, in the lives of all of our brothers and sisters in the human family, and across the spectrum of these two end-posts!

On January 22, Bishop James celebrated the Diocesan *Right to Life Mass* at our diocesan cathedral, and the Bishops of the U.S. **asked us to join the Novena for Life, "Nine Days for Life."** As part of this effort, Father John, celebrated the Day of Prayer for Life and the Legal Protection of Unborn Children here at Sacred Heart on Monday, January 23.

Also, in the January 12 issue of the diocesan *Catholic Spirit*, **Bishop James Checchio teaches us and calls us to continue to support immigrants:** "Jan. 8-14 was the US Catholic Bishops *National Migration Week*. Bishop James wrote, "As



Catholics we believe that all people are children of God and, as such, all inherently are worthy of dignity, welcome and respect, regardless of their country of origin. Recognizing that the family is the

cornerstone of society, we believe that the highest aim of our nation's immigration policy should be uniting and keeping intact families, while honoring and upholding the laws of the nation and without compromising national security or the core principles on which our country was founded."

"Unfortunately, in our country's long broken immigration system, these principles are not fully respected. Moreover, given the harsh rhetoric directed toward immigrants and refugees during the presidential campaign, the situation risks becoming worse. We cannot let that happen. In a November 11 letter to the then president-elect, the Bishops of the United States expressed our collective resolve to "work to promote humane policies that protect refugee and immigrants' inherent dignity, keep families together, and honor and respect the laws of this nation." In the face of the dehumanizing rhetoric toward immigrants in recent months, our letter reminds us all "that behind every 'statistic' is a person who is a mother, father, son, daughter, sister or brother and has dignity as a child of God"

Pope Francis reminded us that "in God's heart there are no enemies. God only has sons and daughters. We are the ones who raise walls, build barriers and label people." "As the local Church in Metuchen, our celebration of National Migration Week reminds us to continue our efforts to serve, build community, and stand in solidarity with immigrants. We will follow this path, established at the inception of our country and illuminated by our values as Christians and as Americans seeking the common good of all. We will continue these efforts and also pray that the laws of our land will promote a healthy system of immigration that benefits all while protecting the security of our country too."

THE FEAST OF ST. BLAISE - February 3. St. Blaise (d. 316) was a doctor and a bishop in what is now modern day Armenia. Known for his ability to heal both body and soul, many people came to him for help. Legend has it that he saved a young boy from choking to death on a fishbone stuck in his throat. Arrested and imprisoned for being a Christian, he was beheaded. We celebrate



his feast day by blessing throats by using two candles and praying a prayer asking for his intercession to protect us from sore throats and other illnesses. This sacramental (a holy object or practice that reminds us of the power of God) is especially appropriate during winter cold and flu season!


THEME 6: Care for God's Creation: We show our respect for the Creator by our *stewardship of creation*. Care for the earth is not just an Earth Day slogan, it is a requirement of our faith. We are called to protect people and the planet, living our faith in relationship with all of God's creation. This environmental challenge has fundamental moral and ethical dimensions that cannot be ignored.

"Following a period of irrational confidence in progress and human abilities, some sectors of society are now adopting a more critical approach. We see increasing sensitivity to the environment and the need to protect nature, along with a growing concern.., for what is happening to our planet. Let us review, however cursorily, those questions which are troubling us today and which we can no longer sweep under the carpet. Some forms of pollution are part of people's daily experience. Exposure to atmospheric pollutants produces a broad spectrum of health hazards, especially for the poor, and causes millions of premature deaths. People take sick, for example, from breathing high levels of smoke from fuels used in cooking or heating. There is also pollution that affects everyone, caused by transport, industrial fumes, substances which contribute to the acidification of soil and water, fertilizers, insecticides, fungicides, herbicides and agrotoxins in general. Technology, which, linked to business interests, is presented as the only way of solving these problems, in fact proves incapable of seeing the mysterious network of relations between things and so sometimes solves one problem only to create others..." #19-20, ENCYCLICAL LETTER, Laudato Si, On Care For Our Common Home, Pope Francis I, May 24, 2015.
