SACRED HEART SOCIAL CONCERNS 2016 REPORT

Thank you and God bless you for your continued support to those in need from our parish family.

With your generosity we were able to help, on a monthly basis, over 34 families with food and financial assistance. During the past year our food pantry has been well stocked with continuous donations of food by parishioners and other residents, in particular the Boy Scouts and Cub Scouts of South Plainfield, Holy Savior Academy, Saint Joseph High School, South Plainfield Social Services, and the South Plainfield Post Office. We distributed 2,040 bags of food to needy families. We also assisted families financially with over \$19,599 plus \$7,600.00 in gift cards for perishable food, clothing, and other personal needs.

For the first time we planted a vegetable garden behind the Parish Center. The garden was a great success allowing us to provide fresh vegetables to families through the Summer into the Fall. We look forward to this first Spring planting.

We are here to serve and offer assistance to anyone who may be in need or is having difficulty with obtaining available resources. We help provide information about other help resources, (Catholic Charities, South Plainfield Social Services, FISH, United Way (211), Puerto Rican Action Board, Middlesex County Board of Social Services, other organizations and agencies)

The primary source of funding is from the Poor Boxes located at all the Church doors. Also, at all doors, bins are provided for your donations of non-perishable food items.

PARISH MEMBERSHIP: Any new family who has moved into the parish area and adult children 18 years of age and older, **are invited to register as a parishioner**. The definition of an active parishioner is: One registered, attending Mass weekly and contributing to the support to the church. There is a (3) month minimum registration requirement before registering for a baptism or requesting letters of eligibility/sponsorship certificates.

BAPTISM/SPONSORSHIP CLASS - Parents and godparents are required to attend one session before the child's baptism date can be confirmed. Sessions are held on **the 1st Tuesday of every month at 7:00PM** in the Parish Center - 3rd floor. (Adults only - please, no infants or children.) Registration is required. Contact Sr. Nadine 908-756-0633 x118 to register for the class or with any questions.

SPONSOR LETTERS - Canon (Church) Law mandates that a Godparent for Baptism and a Sponsor for Confirmation be an active, Confirmed Catholic. An active Catholic is a parishioner who is registered, attends Mass weekly, contributes to the support of the Church, is in a valid Catholic marriage (an individual married civilly by a judge, mayor, or divorced and remarried without an annulment is not eligible to act as a sponsor) and publicly leads a life compatible with Church teaching. Please note that we can only write *Letters of Eligibility* for parishioners who meet these criteria.

THIS IS OUR FAITH

Grace and the Sacraments

This month the parish Whole Community Catechesis (WCC) sessions presented *Grace*, that is, the Life of God in us, and the seven Sacraments.

Asking ourselves the following 2 questions may help us understand why Catholics see the sacraments as an important means for God's Life to be communicated to us.

Q1. So why do we as Catholics believe that God chose

to use sacraments?

Q2. Are sacraments necessary for salvation?

To begin, what is a sacrament? St. Augustine (354-430 AD) one of the Fathers of the Church, taught that a sacrament is a visible sign of invisible grace. Through grace "the faithful become partakers of the Divine nature" CCC 1129. Late in the 16th Century, the Council of Trent stated that "a sacrament is an outward sign of inward grace (sharing in God's Life), instituted, by Christ, for our sanctification (that is-being made holy-ultimately united with God-which is the objective of man.)

- The principal reason for a sacramental system is found in man. It is the nature of man", writes St. Thomas (Aquinas) (III:61:1), "to be led by things corporeal and senseperceptible to things spiritual and intelligible; now Divine Providence provides for everything in accordance with its nature ...; therefore it is fitting that Divine Wisdom should provide means of salvation for men in the form of certain corporeal and sensible signs which are called sacraments."
- "The Incarnation (God becoming man in Jesus Christ) took place because God dealt with men in the manner that was best suited to their nature."
- The Church established by the Savior was to be a visible organization, consequently it should have external ceremonies and symbols of things sacred."
- Above quotes from the New Advent Catholic Encyclopedia.

In Summary. As noted above, Christians believe, that God revealed His plan for salvation primarily in Jesus Christ. The CCC says in paragraph #774, "In this sense, Christ Himself is the mystery (sacrament) of salvation: "For there is no other

mystery of God, except Christ." The saving work of His holy and sanctifying humanity (His Life, Death, and Resurrection) is the sacrament of salvation, which is revealed and active in the Church's sacraments.... The seven sacraments are the signs and instruments by which the Holy Spirit spreads the grace of Christ the head throughout the Church which is His Body."

THEME 6: Care for God's Creation: We show our respect for the Creator by our *stewardship of creation*. Care for the earth is not just an Earth Day slogan, it is a requirement of our faith. We are called to protect people and the planet, living our faith in relationship with all of God's creation. This environmental challenge has fundamental moral and ethical dimensions that cannot be ignored.

"Although each chapter will have its own subject and specific approach, it will also take up and re-examine important questions previously dealt with. This is particularly the case with a number of themes which will reappear as the Encyclical unfolds. As examples, I will point to the intimate relationship between the poor and the fragility of the planet, the conviction that everything in the world is connected, the critique of new paradigms and forms of power derived from technology, the call to seek other ways of understanding the economy and progress, the value proper to each creature, the human meaning of ecology, the need for forthright and honest debate, the serious responsibility of international and local policy, the throwaway culture and the proposal of a new lifestyle.
