



THIS IS OUR FAITH

Fortnight for Freedom

CITIZENS ALL NEITHER DEMOCRAT, REPUBLICAN, LIBERAL NOR CONSERVATIVE

We are graced to live in these United States. With this gift of God to us - to live in a free society - comes the responsibility to exercise our freedom in the light of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. We are called, no, required to view ourselves first and foremost as Catholic Christians, as citizens of Christ's Kingdom; not in some futuristic, eternal sense, but here and now. Our bishops have challenged us to "pray, reflect and act" in defense of Religious Freedom in our country.

This journey of prayer, reflection, and action must begin with Jesus and His teachings, which we can find in Holy Scripture and the teachings of the Church. It does not begin with our wholehearted acceptance of any political party, philosophy, or ideology. As many of our recent popes have reminded us, Jesus calls to us, "Do not be afraid...come follow Me."

Pope Benedict in his 2011 visit to the German Parliament, recounts the story of young King Solomon. The pope begins, "..lt is recounted that God invited the young King Solomon, on his accession to the throne, to make a request. What will the young ruler ask for at this important moment? Success, wealth, long life, destruction of his enemies? He chooses none of these things. Instead, he asks for a listening heart so that he may govern God's people, and discern between good and evil (cf. 1 Kg 3:9).

Through this story, the Bible wants to tell us what should ultimately matter for a politician. The fundamental criterion and the motivation for his work as a politician must not be success, and certainly not material gain. Politics must be a striving for justice, and hence it has to establish the fundamental



preconditions for peace. Naturally a politician will seek success, without which he would have no opportunity for effective political action at all. Yet success is subordinated to the criterion of justice, to the will to do what is right, and to the understanding of what is right."

"The Catholic Church proclaims that human life is sacred and that the dignity of the human person is the foundation of a moral vision for society. This belief is the foundation of all the principles of our social teaching.

... We believe that every person is precious, that people are more important than things, and that the measure of every institution is whether it threatens or enhances the life and dignity of the human person."

(USCCB-Seven Themes of Catholic Social Teaching)

Let us pray, reflect and act as the bishops have requested us. Let us do this in light of the teaching of Our Lord with an eye to giving justice for each person, each human life. As the Two Great Commandments teach "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second is like it: you shall love your neighbor as yourself." MT 22:37-39. In prayer, it is better to have a heart without words than words without a heart. — John Bunyan



WELCOME TO OUR NEW PARISH PRIEST

Rev. Pervaiz Indrias was born on October 16,1962 in Lahore, Pakistan. He is the eldest of four children with two brothers and a sister. He entered St. Mary's Minor Seminary, Lahore in August, 1977. In 1981 he continued his studies and formation at Christ the King Major Seminary, Karachi. Fr. Pervaiz was ordained a priest on August 28, 1987 in Sacred Heart Cathedral, Lahore, by Archbishop Armando Trindade, the Archbishop of Lahore.

His first parochial assignment was as the first diocesan pastor of St. Francis of Assisi Church, Hafizabad from 1987

to 1993, succeeding the Belgian Capuchin Missionaries. Father was then sent to the Philippines for the year to teach a course on Religious Formation (ARFI 16: Asian Religious Formation Institute). On his return, he was appointed Rector of St. Mary's Minor Seminary, Lahore from 1994 to1997. Sent to Rome for a licentiate in Dogmatic Theology, he studied at the



Urbaniana University, from September 1997 to June 1999. On his return, he was appointed resident staff member of St. Francis Xavier Philosophy Seminary, Lahore from 1999 to 2001, then named the Rector of Sacred Heart Cathedral, Lahore until November 2013.

Fr. Pervaiz was appointed Vicar General of the Archdiocese of Lahore from January 2004 to December 2014, serving under two Archbishops. At this time he was also named the pastor of Mary Immaculate Church, Anarlkali, Lahore, from November 2013 to November 2014. He reclaimed St. Francis High School for the Church from the Government after 30 years of takeover.


During the summer months from 1998 through 2014 Father had been serving in this country at St. Patrick Church, Brooklyn, NY. He came to the Diocese of Metuchen in February 2015 and until now has been ministering at McCarrick Care Center and Robert Wood Johnson University Hospital, New Brunswick as Chaplain.

Fr. Pervaiz begins his parochial assignment at Sacred Heart Parish on August 1. We welcome him to our parish family with joy and thanksgiving.
