

**SPONSOR LETTERS** - Canon (Church) Law mandates that a Godparent for Baptism and a Sponsor for Confirmation be an active, Confirmed Catholic. An active Catholic is a parishioner who is registered, attends Mass weekly, contributes to the support of the Church, is in a valid Catholic marriage (an individual married civilly by a judge, mayor, or divorced and remarried without an annulment is not eligible to act as a sponsor) and publicly leads a life compatible with Church teaching. Please note that we can only write *Letters of Eligibility* for parishioners who meet these criteria.

**RETROUVAILLE** - is a lifeline to help couples heal and renew their marriages. The program consists of a weekend experience for married couples (no group discussion) with six follow-up sessions. # Judging Others - We All Do It!

Is this week's Gospel clear to you (Matthew 13:24-43)? It is clear that there is going to be a judgment – Jesus says so.

And the rules for the Last Judgment are also clear. Jesus says "the righteous will shine like the sun in the kingdom of their Father" and "all those who cause others to sin and all evildoers will be thrown into a fiery furnace where there will be wailing and grinding of teeth."

There is also another very important and cautionary injunction that Jesus gives us in this gospel reading. Take note what Jesus has the master say when his servants ask "Do you want us to go and pull up the weeds?" Jesus says the master replies "No, if you pull up the weeds you might uproot the wheat along with them. But let them grow together until harvest, then at harvest I will say to the harvesters first collect the weeds and tie them into bundles for burning, then gather the wheat into my barn."

This clearly tells us that God will be the final judge of what is good and evil. As we go through life we frequently make judgments of who is good or bad. We frequently input motives for people's actions. We make ourselves the judge.


This parable allegory should give us caution. Life may be short but don't rush it. What might look like a weed

now, could be wheat or it may really be a weed. Only God will judge - in the end!

Scripture reminds us of our limitations in judging others:

"Every man's way is right in his own eyes, but the Lord weighs the hearts." — *Proverbs 21:2* 

Or from the book of Samuel:



"but the Lord said to Samuel, "do not look at his appearance or at the height of his stature. because I have rejected him: for God sees not as man sees, for man looks at the outward appearance. but the Lord looks at the heart.""

1 Samuel 16:7

Whenever we are tempted to judge, we should recall these Gospel passages!

"God never tires of forgiving us; we are the ones who tire of seeking His mercy." Pope Francis, The Joy of the Gospel: Evangelii Gaudium

### **WELCOME TO OUR NEW PARISH PRIEST**

**Rev. Pervaiz Indrias** was born on October 16,1962 in Lahore, Pakistan. He is the eldest of four children with two brothers and a sister. He entered St. Mary's Minor Seminary, Lahore in August, 1977. In 1981 he continued his studies and formation at Christ the King Major Seminary, Karachi. Fr. Pervaiz was ordained a priest on August 28, 1987 in Sacred Heart Cathedral, Lahore, by Archbishop Armando Trindade, the Archbishop of Lahore.

His first parochial assignment was as the first diocesan pastor of St. Francis of Assisi Church, Hafizabad from 1987

to 1993, succeeding the Belgian Capuchin Missionaries. Father was then sent to the Philippines for the year to teach a course on Religious Formation (ARFI 16: Asian Religious Formation Institute). On his return, he was appointed Rector of St. Mary's Minor Seminary, Lahore from 1994 to1997. Sent to Rome for a licentiate in Dogmatic Theology, he studied at the



Urbaniana University, from September 1997 to June 1999. On his return, he was appointed resident staff member of St. Francis Xavier Philosophy Seminary, Lahore from 1999 to 2001, then named the Rector of Sacred Heart Cathedral, Lahore until November 2013.

Fr. Pervaiz was appointed Vicar General of the Archdiocese of Lahore from January 2004 to December 2014, serving under two Archbishops. At that time he was also named the pastor of Mary Immaculate Church, Anarlkali, Lahore, from November 2013 to November 2014. He reclaimed St. Francis High School for the Church from the Government after 30 years of takeover.

During the Summer months from 1998 through 2014 Father had been serving in this country at St. Patrick Church, Brooklyn, NY. He came to the Diocese of Metuchen in February 2015 and until now has been ministering at McCarrick Care Center and Robert Wood Johnson University Hospital, New Brunswick as Chaplain.

*Fr.* Pervaiz begins his parochial assignment at Sacred Heart Parish on August 1. We welcome him to our parish family with joy and thanksgiving.
