### **VETERAN'S DAY**

November 11 is the anniversary of the signing of the Armistice in the Forest of Campiegne, France between the Allied Forces and Germany in 1918. The United States entered World War I on

April 6, 1917, and on October 4, 1918 an appeal was made to President Woodrow Wilson by the German government for terms of peace. This Armistice, which lasted one month was renewed until the peace was signed, signified the end of WWI and the German surrender. Originally known as Armistice Day, this day became a legal holiday in 1919. Congress passed a bill in 1938 stating that November 11 would be remembered for it's historical event and as a day dedicated to world peace. After WWII however the meaning of the day had lost its effect. All veterans who had fought in American wars would now be remembered. The first actual Veteran's Day was observed in Emporia, Kansas on November 11, 1953. Congress passed on act to change the name to "Veteran's Day" on May 24, 1954. President Dwight D. Eisenhower signed it into law on June 1, 1954.

We honor all service men and women who have fought in U.S. wars. It is still a good day to pray for peace, especially during this time of conflict and uncertainty.

### Sisters

A number of people have asked some questions about Religious Sisters since the distribution of the Consecrated Life Prayer Cards last weekend. We will take the opportunity in this column to answer them.

What do the letters after a Sister's name mean? Each woman chose a particular Congregation (Order) to join as she discerned her "call" to religious life. It is that particular Order to which she now belongs. Congregations use letters to identify themselves – RSM: Religious Sisters of Mercy, SSJ: Sisters of St. Joseph, RVM: Religious of the Virgin Mary, and SA: Sisters of the Atonement. All 4 Orders or Congregations had sisters serving here at Sacred Heart since 1939. Currently, the Religious Sisters of St. Joseph are in ministry in the parish. EVERY card that was distributed had the name of a Sister who served here at Sacred Heart.

Where are these Sisters now? The first group of sisters to serve here were Sisters of the Atonement in 1939. Most of those sisters, if not all of them, are deceased. The RVM's and the RSM's still have sisters in active ministry or retired. (If you received a card with the name of a sister who had the initials RSM after her name, you can ask Sr. Nadine for information.)

How do the Congregations differ? What we all share in common is the vows. Every religious sister takes vows of poverty, chastity and obedience. Where the Congregations differ is in their particular *charism* or gift they bring as a Congregation to the Church. To quote from the documents of the Sisters: Sisters of Mercy: "... to act in solidarity with the economically poor of the world, especially women and children." The Sisters of St. Joseph: "... in the following of Christ she works in order to achieve unity both of neighbor with neighbor and neighbor with God directly and indirectly through all works of mercy." Religious of the Virgin Mary: "...personal sanctification and perfection... and laboring for the sanctification and salvation of others through Catholic education of youth and catechetical instruction in parishes, as well as fostering spiritual retreats among lay women ...."

In visiting different Congregations, meeting the sisters and learning about their history, charism, and ministries, a woman will feel a particular attraction to one Congregation over another. This is the Holy Spirit working within her and leading her to fulfill her "call" to religious life within a particular Order.
