

BAPTISM/SPONSORSHIP CLASS - Parents and godparents are required to attend one session before the child's baptism date can be confirmed. Sessions are held on **the 1st Tuesday of every month at 7:00PM** in the Parish Center - 3rd floor. (Adults only - please, no infants or children.) Registration is required. Contact Sr. Nadine 908-756-0633 x118 to register for the class or with any questions.

SPONSOR LETTERS - Canon (Church) Law mandates that a Godparent for Baptism and a Sponsor for Confirmation be an active, Confirmed Catholic. An active Catholic is a parishioner who is registered, attends Mass weekly, contributes to the support of the Church, is in a valid Catholic marriage (an individual married civilly by a judge, mayor, or divorced and remarried without an annulment is not eligible to act as a sponsor) and publicly leads a life compatible with Church teaching. Please note that we can only write *Letters of Eligibility* for parishioners who meet these criteria.

PARISH MEMBERSHIP: Any new family who has moved into the parish area and adult children 18 years of age and older, **are invited to register as a parishioner**. The definition of an active parishioner is: One registered, attending Mass weekly and contributing to the support to the church. There is a (3) month minimum registration requirement before registering for a baptism or requesting letters of eligibility/sponsorship certificates.

AED IN CHURCH - An Automated External Defibrillator (AED) is a portable electronic device that automatically diagnoses the life-threatening cardiac arrhythmias of ventricular fibrillation and ventricular tachycardia in a patient, and is able to treat them through defibrillation allowing the heart to reestablish an effective rhythm. We have purchased & installed an AED in church to assist in emergency medical situations. The AED is door-mounted next to the St. Joseph statue at the front of the church.

THIS IS OUR FAITH

You Are the Church

Is you name Joan, Michael, Tom ...? Are you male, female, young, old? Are you a citizen, an immigrant, free, in-jail? Are you black, white; holy, a sinner; a priest, a nun, a bishop, a pope? Are you living on Earth, in Heaven or in Purgatory? Are you the Church?

Vatican Council II, in the Dogmatic Constitution on the Church, (Lumen Gentium meaning: "Light of the Nations"), uses the image of the Church as "the People of God." So the Church is not the building we worship in, it is not the Pope and Bishops who lead us. THE CHURCH is all the people of God.

We become members of the Church by a spiritual birth through faith in Jesus Christ and Baptism. Jesus Christ is head of the Church (His People), whose law is the love of God and neighbor. God's people includes the popes, patriarchs, bishops, priests, deacons, religious men and women, the laity - that's us in the pews. Each group (The Church Militant on Earth; The Church Suffering in Purgatory; The Church Triumphant in Heaven) has its special mission and responsibility.



The overall mission of the Church (the People of God, the "Light of the Nations") calls each of us is to be the salt of the earth and the light of the world in our own special way, and with the special gifts the Lord has given us through the Holy Spirit. Our destiny as a member of the People

of God, is to share eternity with our Risen Lord, in our own Risen Body, and to bring our culture, our world and as many people as possible along with us.

Jesus Christ founded the Church through his choice of the 12 Apostles with Peter as her head. At His Ascension, Jesus gave the Church it's Great Commission, "Go, therefore," and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you.^{*} And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age." MT 28:19-20.

We the Militant, Suffering, Triumphant are parts of the mystical body of Christ. But those of us living today are not members of this body simply by sitting in Church. Jesus said "if you love me you will keep my commandments" and "my command is this, love one another as I love vou." To be a disciple of Jesus, we don't only say the prayers, come to Mass, do daily devotions, etc. No. we must live His radical law of love. How radical is His love? Just look at the Cross! Jesus loved us so much, that because of His love He died for us. Because of His love, we are called to die to ourselves and to live for God and others.

This journey of discipleship takes a lifetime, so we cannot become discouraged when we fall short of the radical love to which Jesus calls us. When we fall short we need to focus on Jesus, His mercy and love. We must trust in His Grace through Prayer and the Sacraments, especially Reconciliation and the Eucharist; the Gifts of the Holy Spirit, and the intercession of our brothers and sisters in Heaven, and then again take one step at a time on the road to discipleship, the road of radical love.


