

VETERAN'S DAY- November 11 is the anniversary of the signing of the Armistice in the Forest of Campiegne, France between the Allied Forces and Germany in 1918. The United States entered World War I on April 6, 1917, and on October 4, 1918 an appeal was made to President Woodrow Wilson by the German government for terms of peace. This Armistice, which lasted one month was renewed until the peace was

signed, signified the end of WWI and the German surrender. Originally known as Armistice Day, this day became a legal holiday in 1919. Congress passed a bill in 1938 stating that November 11 would be remembered for it's historical event and as a day dedicated to world peace. After WWII however the meaning of the day had lost its effect. All veterans who had fought in American wars would now be remembered. The first actual Veteran's Day was observed in Emporia, Kansas on November 11, 1953. Congress passed on act to change the name to "Veteran's Day" on May 24, 1954. President Dwight D. Eisenhower signed it into law on June 1, 1954.

We honor all service men and women who have fought in U.S. wars. It is still a good day to pray for peace, especially during this time of conflict and uncertainty.

THIS IS OUR FAITH

Don't Waste the Year of Mercy

The Year Of Mercy will close on November 20, 2016 - The Feast of Christ the King. With its close, the opportunity to earn the Jubilee Year Indulgence will also end!

What is an indulgence? Simply put, it is the remission of temporal punishment due to sin. The plenary indulgence associated with the Jubilee Year of Mercy is meant to eliminate time in Purgatory. Today fewer people say that they believe in Purgatory. The Church Fathers, the saints, and history itself tell us otherwise. "On April 29, 1926, Saint Faustina Kowalska, revealed that she was visited three times by a recently-deceased nun. During the apparitions, the soul begged Sister Faustina for help so that she could be released from Purgatory." Saint Padre Pio that "there were more souls of the dead who come up the road [leading to the monastery] than souls of the living." — *Hungry Souls* by Gerard J.M. van den Aardweg

Pope Francis grants to the following persons the opportunity to receive a jubilee indulgence:

Those who make a pilgrimage to a Door of Mercy in Rome or a Door of Mercy designated by the diocesan bishop, (closest to South Plainfield is the Holy Door at St. Francis Cathedral in Metuchen) and who receive sacramental absolution and Communion within several days of the pilgrimage and offer a Profession of Faith and a prayer (Our Father, Hail Mary, etc.) for the Pope's intentions;

Those unable to enter a Door of Mercy, "particularly the sick and people who are elderly and alone [and] often confined to the home," and who unite their suffering to the Lord's passion and, if possible, receive Communion and attend Holy Mass or some community prayer, even if by means of radio or television;

Those who are incarcerated, who make a pilgrimage to their prison chapel or "direct their thought and prayer to the Father each time they cross the threshold of their cell";

Those who perform a spiritual or corporal work of mercy during the Jubilee Year.



THE SPIRITUAL WORKS OF MERCY: Counsel the Doubtful; Instruct the Ignorant; Admonish Sinners; Comfort the Afflicted; Forgive Offenses; Bear Wrongs Patiently; Pray for the Living and the Dead.

THE CORPORAL WORKS OF MERCY: Feed the Hungry; Give Drink to the Thirsty; Clothe the Naked; Shelter the Homeless; Visit the Sick; Visit the Imprisoned; Bury the Dead;

The Jubilee Indulgence can be applied to oneself or for the deceased.

A plenary indulgence can be gained only once a day. In order to obtain it, the faithful must, in addition to being in the state of grace also have the interior disposition of complete detachment from sin, even venial sin.
