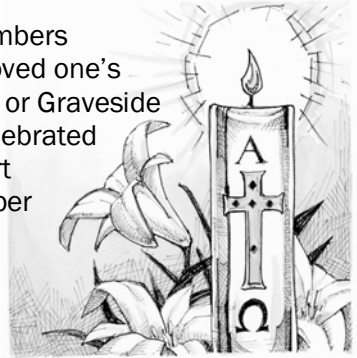


MASS OF REMEMBRANCE

PAPAL QUOTE AND CATHOLIC SOCIAL TEACHING - THEME 6: Care for God's Creation

"We show our respect for the Creator by our **stewardship of creation**. Care for the earth is not just an Earth Day slogan, it is a requirement of our faith. We are called to protect people and the planet, living our faith in relationship with all of God's creation. This environmental challenge has fundamental moral and ethical dimensions that cannot be ignored.

"... Man, who discovers his capacity to transform and in a certain sense create the world through his own work, forgets that this is always based on God's prior and original gift of the things that are. Man thinks that he can make arbitrary use of the earth, subjecting it without restraint to his will, as though it did not have its own requisites and a prior God-given purpose, which man can indeed develop but must not betray. Instead of carrying out his role as a co-operator with God in the work of creation, man sets himself up in place of God and thus ends up provoking a rebellion on the part of nature, which is more tyrannized than governed by him. **Centesimus Annus, ON THE HUNDRETH ANNIVERSARY OF RERUM NOVARUM**, John Paul II, May 1, 1991.

Prayer Before an Election:
