

#15 - 9/11 and Our Eternal Home

Today we mark the fifteenth anniversary of "9/11. I am sure that you can recall where you were on that day. For me, it vividly brings back the memories of exactly where I was when I saw the first tower of the WTC in flames, and then the realization that it was much more than a terrible accident when the second tower was hit. It brings back the terrible pain we all felt when we saw the WTC on fire, the people jumping to escape the inferno; and then the towers collapsing to the ground. It brings back all the fear we relive grown children returning home to be with their families, and families huddled together for support. It brings back the vulnerability we felt with this attack on our homeland, and the feelings that continue to today.

This anniversary also brings back the question that many of us asked that day, when the 3,000 died in the towers. That question is, how can a good God let this happen? The memory of 9/11 forces us to ask this question again. Just like the memory of December 7, 1941 did for our parent's generation. But this question is not limited to the United States. No, this question was asked by the Jews after 6 million were murdered during the holocaust. It was asked by the whole world as they fought the Second World War, where over 60 million died; 22 million who were soldiers. It is being asked now as tens of thousands of refugees are dying in the Middle East and millions are fleeing their homes. Humans have asked this question repeatedly through history as we confront the effects of evil.

We try to cling to our faith, when we have lost someone close, or when we are so afraid of what is going to happen to us, to our children, to this life that we know and to which we are so desperately attached. But the words and thoughts of faith sometimes leave us feeling empty. What do we say? Why does God allow evil? Why do good people suffer?

What does our faith offer us? As Christians we believe that God made us to know Him, to love Him, to serve Him in this world and to be happy with Him in the next. But we forget this last part of the sentence, we focus on this life and this world, but our Faith, our Savior, only promises happiness in the next, not here and now.

Jesus calls us to know, love and serve God and our neighbor. It is in this way we achieve salvation, eternal life, and happiness. Jesus' path to know, love and serve God and neighbor was through the cross, and He calls each of us to take up our cross and follow Him. This path does not give us the warm feeling we may want ... that our Faith, our God, is going to fix everything in this life. For Christians, reality is only partially reflected in the here and now. It exists in the fullness of time, in eternity. St Paul makes this clear in 1 Corinthians 15 when he says: "If there is no resurrection of the dead, then neither has Christ been raised . And if Christ has not been raised, then empty [too] is our preaching; empty, too, your faith. ... and if Christ has not been raised.^{*} vour faith is vain: vou are still in vour sins. Then those who have fallen asleep in Christ have perished. If for this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are the most pitiable people of all."

We are a resurrection people. Every Sunday we come to this church to praise, reverence and serve God, and from here to go and serve our neighbor and our world. As we profess in the Nicene Creed each and every Sunday, *"I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen."*

So let us remember Jesus Christ risen from the dead, and all those who died on 9/11, in every other human tragedy and every lost loved one rising with Him. Let us hold deeply to the truth of Our Lord's and our resurrection for without this we are the most pitiable of people.

REDUCE, REUSE, RECYCLE

SUSTAINABILITY TIP — Water Usage: Lower the amount of energy used to pump, treat, and heat water by washing your car less often, using <u>climate-appropriate plants</u> in your garden, installing drip irrigation so that plants receive only what they need, and making water-efficient choices when purchasing shower heads, faucet heads, toilets, dishwashers and washing machines.
