This gift has no strings attached, just an open and generous opportunity to plant a seed and an invitation to come back again.

Through the generosity of several parish and community groups, The Knights of Columbus, The Altar Rosary Society, FAASH, the KofC Squires, the Columbiettes, and private donors the PPC was able to give each parish family a Christmas gift in 2014, which, as you know was a copy of the CD *Becoming the Best Version of Yourself and* in 2015 the book *Rediscover Jesus*. We have received many positive comments about the gift and we thank you again for your support.

The PPC would like to provide each family with a book this Christmas but we need your help. If you are able to support this effort with a donation of ANY amount the PPC would be most appreciative. Message from the Parish Pastoral Council

The members of the Pastoral Parish Council thank all the parishioners who took the time to respond to the survey on the Dynamic Catholic Book Program.

A review of the responses from 491 parishioners indicates that we should continue the program.

The majority of the responses came from parishioners over the age of 45 however we were pleased to have about 75 responses from younger parishioners. In a report from Dynamic Catholic from 2007, only 1% of American Catholics read a Catholic book. The Dynamic Catholic Book Program increased that number to 9.3% in 2012. That is a 900% increase in just five short years. Your responses indicate that 27% of you read the book distributed at The Church of the Sacred Heart this year. That's way ahead of the national average of 1% almost 10 years ago. 17% of you shared the book with others and 55% of you kept it. So, if you still haven't read it, dust it off and READ!

Self-reporting of improved spiritual habits are impressive:

more frequent attendance at Sunday Mass; 8% attending daily Mass more often; 7% more frequent reception of the Eucharist; 6% more frequent use of the Sacrament of Confession; 12% increased prayer; 30% increased scripture reading; 20% Increased care of others; 24%

The PPC also read and saved all comments that were written on the survey. Many of the suggestions align with the goals of Whole Community Catechesis/Faith Formation Program starting in the parish this Fall.



BLESSED MIGUEL PRO

A holy site of visitation on our Parish Pilgrimage to OLG & Mexico, Oct 29-Nov 4



"Viva Cristo Rey!"

As he faced a firing squad for serving the Catholic faithful in Mexico at a time when Catholicism was outlawed and severely persecuted, Fr. Miguel Pro of the Society of Jesus made a request. He asked to have a moment to pray on his knees, then he stood up, stretched out his arms in the imitation of Christ on the cross and submitted himself to his martyrdom, shouting "Viva Christo Rey!" This moment was photographed, and so we can look into the face of a martyr at the moment of his execution. What is astonishing about the images is the serenity with which Blessed Miguel submits himself to the state. He does not respond with violent resistance, because he is at peace with God. From that place of peace, the martyr triumphs over tyranny. Government cannot take away his inner freedom, the freedom that belongs to any person who submits himself totally to God.

Due in part to Blessed Miguel's witness, the Mexican government was shamed and an uprising gained the strength to stand up to religious persecution, as well as other injustices. He did not know it at the time, but his death inspired a larger defense of political and religious freedom that has since permitted the Church to live more publicly her call to holiness.

Freedom through surrender is a paradox that is hard to understand and at times harder to live. Nonetheless, we are all called, like Blessed Miguel, to live in the freedom that only comes through an imitation of Christ's faithful obedience.

Blessed Miguel's life and death remains a witness to complete surrender to Christ in a way to which we might struggle to relate. Yet, we are all called to order our lives to Christ. We may not be asked to die for our faith, but we are asked to give each moment of the day to the Lord. This capacity requires freedom from sin, freedom from selfishness, freedom from all those things that stand between us and God.

Blessed Miguel Pro reminds us that even in extreme circumstances, we find true freedom when we live first for Christ. That witness, when adopted in our lives, may even inspire others to similar acts of love.
