

#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

#### St. Bernadette's attitude toward money By Rev. Roland Lacasse, s.m.

One day a journalist said to Bernadette, "You must come to Parish with me. In three weeks, you will be rich." She replied, "No, I want to remain poor." Most people today, giddy with the possibility of suddenly becoming rich, yearn to win the lottery. They dream about what they would do with the money. Unfortunately, many confess that if they were to win the lottery, they would spend the money on themselves instead of sharing it with some charity that would benefit mankind.

I belong to a religious congregation whose founder warned Marists to beware of greed in all its forms. He knew the danger of greed and how it could become the downfall of many a Religious Congregation. It is not surprising that the Church regards greed as one of the seven capital sins, from which all other orginate.

Not long ago, I was reading about some of the millionaires that America has produced. One of them is reported to have said, "The man who dies rich and who hoards his money and refuses to use any of it for good and mankind is a scandal!"

I often wonder what I would have done had I remained in the world and won the lottery. There are so many worthy causes that beg us for help, it's really overwhelming. I admire the late Paul Newman for donating all the profits he made from his salad dressing, etc., to charity. When he died, he did not appear empty-handed at the gate of heaven. His good works accompanied him.

I think it's good for everyone to ask themselves the question, "What would I do with the money if I won the lottery?" The answer would reveal where your values lie. St. Bernadette is reported to have been given some coins one day, and she was quick to complain that the money burned in her pocket. That would not be the reaction of most people today. Instead, they would rejoice over their good fortune. Someone once said, "Money is a good tool but a terrible master." The happiest people in the world are those who have what they need and do not hunger for more. How would you define happiness? In the early Church, Christians were encouraged to share whatever they had to give to the poor. No one was allowed to suffer from poverty.

In Religious Life, need is the standard for receiving anything, and our model for living is that of the ordinary workingman. We are constantly exhorted to remain detached from material things to use them as needed, but not to become attached to them. One day we will all have to leave them behind. The only thing we will be able to take with us when we die is the good we have done while we were on earth.

St. Berneadette knew this well, and lived by it. She was only 35 when she died, rich only in good works. What she did in her short lifetime, she did in God's way, not in her own way, despite what the song says, "I did it my way!"


