

As we get closer to Lent, I will be sending home resources that can be used as family discussions on how to help your child understand the season of Lent, and age appropriate ways for your child to observe


this important liturgical season.

## Questions and Answers about Lent and Lenten Practices

Q. I understand that Catholics ages 18 to 59 should fast on Ash Wednesday and on Good Friday, but what exactly are the rules for these fasts?

A. Fasting on these days means we can have only one full, meatless meal. Some food can be taken at the other regular meal times if necessary, but combined they should be less than a full meal. Liquids are allowed at any time, but no solid food should be consumed between meals.

Q. Are there exemptions other than for age from the requirement to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday?

A. Those that are excused from fast and abstinence outside the age limits include the physically or mentally ill including individuals suffering from chronic illnesses such as diabetes. Also excluded are pregnant or nursing women. In all cases, common sense should prevail, and ill persons should not further jeopardize their health by fasting.

# Ash Wednesday What's with that dirt on your head?



Who hasn't gotten that question on Ash Wednesday before? Do you feel silly when people ask you about your ashes? And is it hard to answer their questions? Having ashes on your forehead isn't just some weird Catholic thing: it's a tradition that finds its roots in the Old Testament. "I turned to the Lord God, to seek help, in prayer and petition, with fasting, sackcloth, and ashes" (Daniel 9:3).

When the ashes are placed on our foreheads in the sign of the Cross, it is a reminder of several things.

First, it is a call to repentance: a physical sign that we are sinners in need of forgiveness, which is how the prophets used it in the Old Testament.

Second, it is to remind us that God created us from the earth and when we die, we will return to it.






El 13 de febrero a las 6:30pm celebraremos el Mardi Gras (martes de carnaval)
