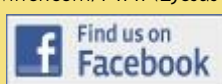

The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

In our reading for today, we read the account of the Last Supper found in the Gospel of Mark. It begins with the instructions that Jesus gave to his disciples to prepare their Passover celebration. It then goes on to give an account of the Last Supper. On this Sunday, however, our Lectionary reading omits the verses between these two passages; in those omitted verses we hear Jesus predict his betrayal by one of his disciples.



Similar words and actions follow as Jesus shares the chalice with his disciples. This bread now shared is Jesus' own body. Those who drink from the chalice are invited to share in a new covenant which will be sealed by Jesus' own blood. Mark's Eucharistic theology looks forward to the Kingdom of God that Jesus inaugurates.

In the description of the Passover meal found in today's Gospel, however, Mark omits many elements of the Jewish Passover meal. Instead he describes only those elements he believes to be most essential to the Christian Eucharist: Jesus took bread, blessed the bread, broke the bread, and shared it with his disciples.

The Gospel for today reminds us that the Eucharist is a memorial of Christ's sacrifice on the cross. We believe that Jesus is truly present to us in the elements of bread and wine. Each time we celebrate this sacrament, we prepare for the Kingdom of God. This celebration, as the Second Vatican Council taught us, is the source and summit of the Christian life.

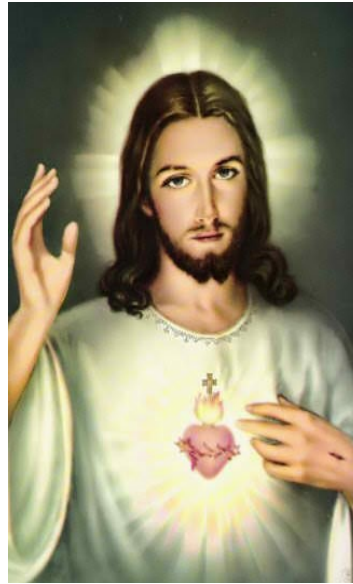
You Can Make A Difference

THE MOST SACRED HEART OF JESUS JUNE 8TH

The heart has always been seen as the "center" or essence a person ("the heart of the matter," "you are my heart," "take it to heart," etc.) and the wellspring of our emotional lives and love ("you break my heart," "my heart sings," etc.) Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus is devotion to Jesus Christ Himself, but in the particular ways of meditating on his interior life and on His threefold love -- His divine love, His burning love that fed His human will, and His sensible love that affects His interior life.



The Friday that follows the Second Sunday in Time After Pentecost is the Feast of the Sacred Heart which brings to mind all the attributes of His Divine Heart mentioned above. Many Catholics prepare for this Feast by beginning a Novena to the Sacred Heart on the Feast of Corpus Christi, which is the Thursday of the week before. On the Feast of the Sacred Heart itself, we can gain a plenary indulgence by making an Act of Reparation to the Sacred Heart.

Formación en la Fe

El Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo

El evangelio de hoy trata el relato de la Última Cena según san Marcos.

Comienza con las instrucciones que Jesús le dio a sus discípulos para preparar la cena de la Pascua. Después continúa con el relato de la Última Cena. Pero este domingo, la lectura del leccionario omite los versículos entre estos dos pasajes; en los versículos omitidos, Jesús menciona que sería traicionado por uno de sus discípulos.

Pero en la descripción de la Cena de la Pascua en el Evangelio de hoy, san Marcos omite mucho de los elementos de la Cena de la Pascua judía. Lo que hace es que describe solamente los elementos que san Marcos considera que son más esencial para la Eucaristía cristiana: Jesús tomó un pan, pronunció la bendición y se lo dio a sus discípulos.



Jesús usó palabras similares cuando compartió la copa con ellos. El pan es el propio cuerpo de Jesús.

Los que toman de ese cáliz son invitados a ser parte de la nueva alianza que es sellada con la propia sangre de Jesús. La teología eucarística de san Marcos queda en espera del Reino de Dios que Jesús inauguró.

El evangelio de hoy nos recuerda que la Eucaristía es un recordatorio del sacrificio de Cristo en la cruz. Nosotros creemos que Jesús está verdaderamente presente para nosotros en las especies del pan y del vino. Cada vez que celebramos este sacramento, nos preparamos para el Reino de Dios. Como nos enseñó el Segundo Concilio Vaticano, esta celebración es la fuente y cumbre de la vida cristiana.

Invitamos a todas las mujeres a participar con nosotros.

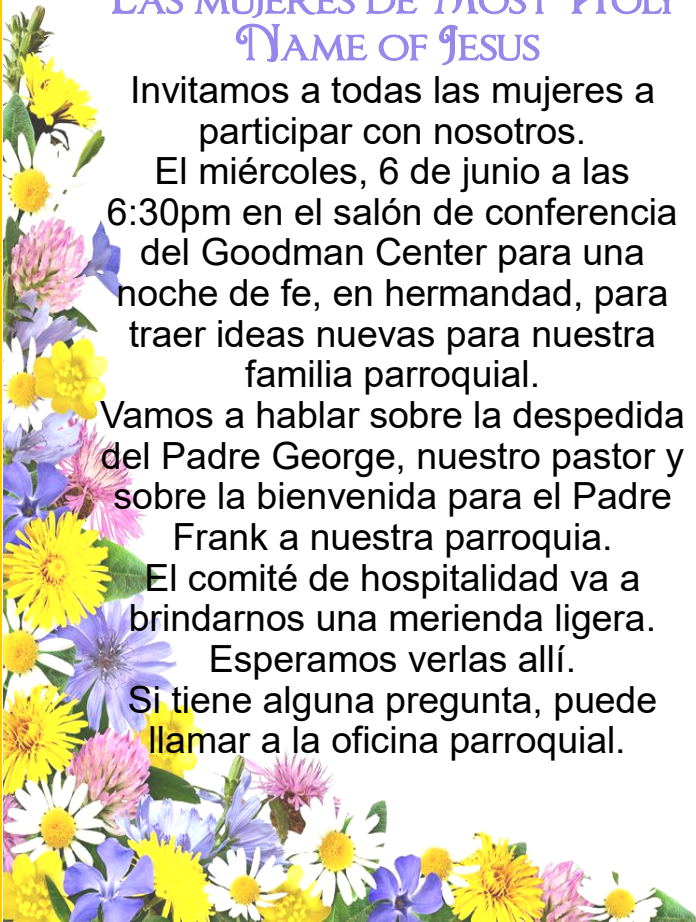
