Second Reading: Ephesians 4:1-6

Paul exhorts his readers to practice those virtues which make the common life possible. He also stresses the oneness of God to the Ephesian converts from polytheism.



Gospel: John 6: I-I5

This well-known miracle story is a direct preparation for the greater miracle of the Eucharist, by which multiple generations have been, and will be fed by Jesus.

THE WORD THIS WEEK



For the next five weeks we take our leave of Saint Mark's Gospel (since it is not long enough to fill the year) and read Chapter Six of Saint John's Gospel. This is the famous "Eucharistic Discourse" and begins with the miracle of the feeding of the five thousand. A line of the Psalm gives the meaning of today's readings: "The eyes of all creatures look to you (O God) and you give them their food in due time." Our God is the God who

provides for his people; the prosperity and fruitfulness of our earth and the mysterious cycles of nature ensures that all have what they need - and have some left over. The actions of Elisha and Jesus are in a sense prophetic: many would say that there is not enough food in this world to go round, just as the two sets of disciples complain that there is not enough for the hundred or the five thousand. But the prophetic action states that this is not true: God provides what is needed. This might prompt us to think about the unfair and unequal distribution of the fruits of the earth: the miracle is a sign of the Kingdom of God - what God wants the world to be like. Perhaps we should take the message of the miracle to heart this Sunday and think about the multitude that still sits in hunger in our world today.

Dear Friends,

First of all I want to thank all the volunteers who helped with the annual celebration of Our Lady of Mount Carmel Novena and Feast. The nine days of novena went smoothly and this year I noticed that we had more attendees each night at the novena. The sacristans, the ushers, the altar servers, and the choir members came faithfully every day to make sure that everything was properly arranged.

The feast day celebrations on July 16th went efficiently without any serious problems. Thanks to the cooperation of our parishioners, CYO and some volunteers from the Haitian prayer group made sure that things were organized in a better fashion this year. We had the setup, the breakdown and the cleanup crews who ensured that everything was in place before the celebration and that everything was put away and the property was cleaned up after the celebration. The help of these crew members made it possible for everything to be done on the same day.

We had the sacristans who made sure that the church was ready with all the items needed for the celebration of the Eucharist. The ushers helped the people with seating both inside and outside of the Church and coordinated the collections so that these would be done more efficiently. We had a group of guides who were assisting especially non-parishioners who were not familiar with the property, by helping them with information and directions.

A special crew was at the parking lot, a difficult place to handle, especially when the traffic gets backed up on the street. They did a great job with guiding the traffic and directing the cars to parking spaces in order to keep the traffic flowing well and fast. There are always some people who will want to park where they want. Even with that challenge, the parking crew did a great job trying to get everyone a parking space without much delay. If they were not there to

help, the parking lot could have turned out to be a messy lot.

The Mount Carmel Committee members who were the general organizers did a wonderful job with the decoration of the statue of the Blessed Mother, arranging for the novena and preparing and serving the food. I had left these in their hands, as I wanted to focus more on the Eucharist and the matters concerning the celebrations in the Church.

Everything worked out as I had hoped because I was told that there would be a serious problem if we did not have the tent. The reason I was not willing to get a tent was the cost and the amount of extra work that goes along with it. The big tent alone would cost way more than what the collection would bring in on the day of the feast. Apart from the big tent, there would have to be smaller tents setup to accommodate the choir, the altar and the statue. Furthermore, we would have needed to get the furniture out there, like the altar, ambo, chairs for the celebrants, the altar servers, and the choir members. We would also have needed to bring in electricity and install lighting, all the items needed for the Mass, set up a separate sound system, etc. All these additional undertakings could be avoided by having the Mass in the Church. This is why I made the decision to have the Mass in the Church this year and everything worked out well.

Once again, a big thank you to all the volunteers who helped in one way or the other to make the celebration a great success. Without your help we would not have been able to successfully celebrate this feast. I look forward to greater cooperation from our parish community next year.
