First Reading: Job 38:1, 8-11

Yahweh, having asked Job about his absence at the event, describes the creation of the sea in poetic terms as a newborn baby needing His care.

Second Reading: II Corinthians 5:14-17

Paul insists that a radical change of thinking and living must be part of the life of a true apostle. Christ's life is the model.

Gospel: Mark 4:35-41

This calming of the storm is the first of three miraculous actions of Jesus presented to us by Mark. The turbulent sea was an ancient symbol of the powers of chaos warring against God. Mark wants us to answer the question of Jesus' identity based on the evidence he supplies.

THE WORD THIS WEEK



There is a strangely simple theme to this Sunday: that God has power over the forces of nature, because

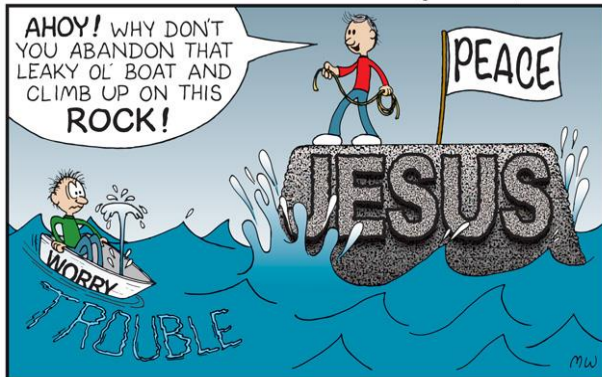
he created them in the first place. This is what the first reading tells us, and also what the gospel shows us, when Jesus “rebukes the wind”. This tells us something about Jesus (that he is God made man), and also something about our faith. It's also interesting that the disciples react to this miracle with fear and awe - as if their minds were suddenly opened to a reality they had not realized before. They had chosen to follow the Christ who had called them, but we see their understanding of who he is growing and developing. Perhaps this is of comfort to us, as we see our relationship with the Lord who controls the waters grow and develop, and alerts us to be ready for the surprises that following the Lord can bring.

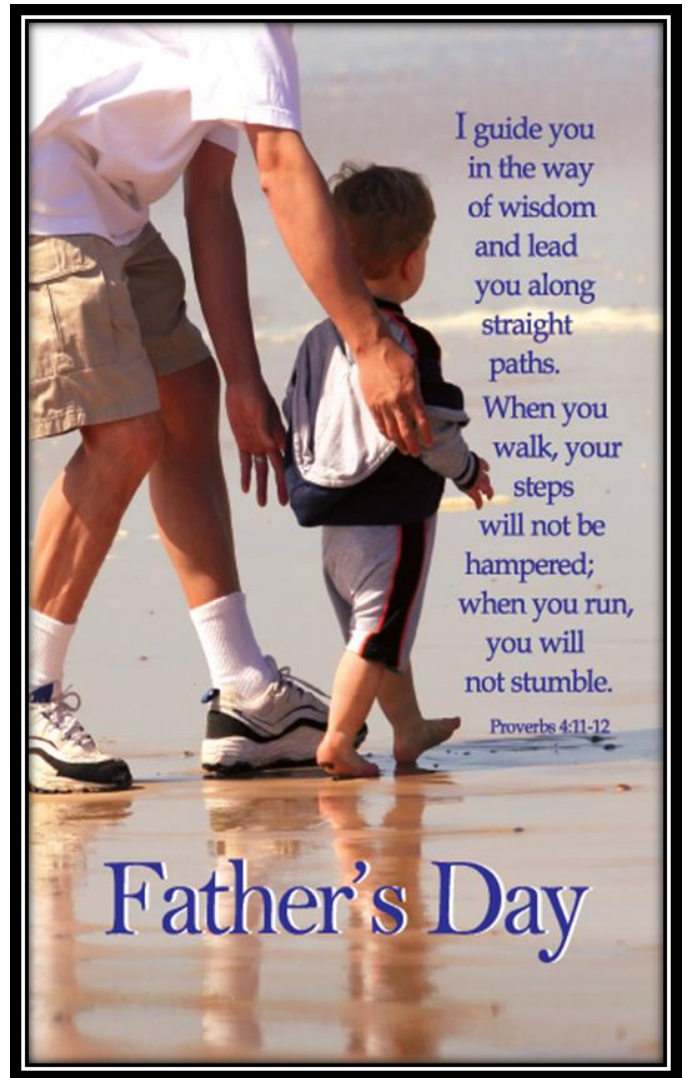

Dear Friends,

This Sunday we celebrate Father's Day. Contrary to popular belief, the Father's Day was not started by some greeting card company to promote sale of another special card so that they can make more money. It is a day to recognize the sacrifices that good and devoted fathers make for the sake of their children. It was started by Sonora Smart Dodd of Spokane, WA. She wanted to honor her father who was a civil war veteran and was widowed when his wife died giving birth to their sixth child. Her father raised the new born and the other five children on a farm in Eastern Washington State. She wanted her father to know how special he was to her. Her father had made all the sacrifices required of a parent to raise his six children. In the eyes of his daughter, he was a courageous, self-sacrificing and loving man who took on his parental responsibility seriously and fulfilled it to the best of his ability. Inspired by a Mother's Day sermon she heard in 1909, she celebrated the Father's Day on June 19, 1910.

There are certainly many such stories of fathers who have given so much of their lives for their children and I am sure practically every father here has a similar story of countless sacrifices he has made for his children. But in general in the past father's roles in the family was more of a bread winner. He was not as involved in the day to day parenting of the children. But today, in our society, things have changed so much, that the fathers need to become very personally involved in the upbringing of their children. With the challenges from the world around him, it is not easy for a father to be a care giver, emotional supporter, a role model for his children and an equal partner in the parenting team. And yet this has to be done. Every father must realize that the most important job in his life is that

of being a father. What is often forgotten is also the fact that it is a very rewarding job.

On Father's Day, a call is given to the fathers to commit themselves to their parenting responsibilities. Unfortunately the failure of some fathers to fulfill the obligations toward their children has given the wrong impression that being the father is being less of a parent than the mother. Both are equal parents and both have equal responsibilities in raising their children. Due to the many stories of irresponsible fathers, the vast majority of good and dedicated fathers are forgotten. Today is the day for the fathers to recommit themselves to their children. It is also a day to acknowledge the great sacrifices they have made for the sake of their children. Let me share with you what Mario Cuomo wrote about his father: "I watched a small man with thick calluses on both hands work fifteen and sixteen hours a day. I saw him once literally bleed from the bottoms of his feet, a man who came here uneducated, alone, unable to speak the language, who taught me all I needed to know about faith and hard work by the simple eloquence of his example."

God is our father and he sets the example for all fathers. From the very beginning of creation he chose us to be holy and blameless. "In love he destined us for adoption to himself through Jesus Christ, in accord with the favor of his will, for the praise of the glory of his grace that he granted us in the beloved." (Ep 1:5f) He has thus become Father to us. He is willing to do anything, endure everything and sacrifice life itself, so that His fatherly love can be shown to us. He has shown us the way to be a father. Let us thank God for his own fatherly care for us, and for the many blessings our fathers have brought into our lives.
