
## THE WORD THIS WEEK

Today we are invited to marvel at one of the most dramatic and amazing of the Lord's miracles – the raising back to life of the daughter of Jairus. The story is told with a level of emotional realism: the calm faith but



dreadful fear of Jairus, the servants who bring the news of his daughter's death, the calm reassurance of Jesus and even the laughter of the servant who mock Jesus – all these make this a story that can engage us and speak to us.


And what it says is something profound: all the miracles of the Lord proclaim the Kingdom of God – the world the way God wants it to be. God does not want us to die: death is not part of God's plan for us. This is reinforced by the unfamiliar first reading from the book of Wisdom, which opens our listening to God's Word today with the dramatic phrase: "Death was not God's doing." God created us to live forever, and the raising of Jairus' daughter to life is a vivid and outstanding proclamation of this truth.

Dear Friends,

I wish to thank all the parishioners who supported the Father's Day breakfast arranged by our Vincent de Paul Society. Different ministries like the CYO, the Legion of Mary, and the Women's council helped with the arrangements and preparations for the same and most importantly all of you made it a success with your participation. I also want to thank all those who bought and donated the tickets to me. Although I ate only one breakfast, the poor were blessed with the cost of the other 19 tickets.

Recently there has been much talk about the latest encyclical *Laudato Si* issued by Pope Francis on Thursday, June 18, 2015. While different people may look at it from different angles, the Pope is not writing as a scientist or a politician. He is presenting the moral obligation of each of us to care for creation. It comes from the very simple concept of being good stewards of creation. While scientists and politicians may give a scientific or political twist to the issues presented by the Pope in his encyclical, he is writing as a pastor offering moral guidance rooted in central Catholic teachings about the care for others and the care for God's creation. The poor are always more vulnerable and suffer most when we

don't responsibly care for the whole of creation. It is not just about us here and right now, but about the whole human family, now and of the future. Responsibly caring for the natural world will help all people. Every day, environmental impacts affect the lives of countless people right here in our own land and around the world. How we put the nature to our use will depend on what we want to leave behind for our children and grandchildren and for generations to come. The Church is Universal and is present in practically every nation in the world. The pope is not addressing the encyclical to one country or the other, but to the Catholics, to remind them of their role in responsibly caring for the whole of creation. The Catholic understanding of integral ecology links together the care for others and the care for God's creation.

Some may disagree with some of the points in the encyclical. The teaching of the encyclical is not about science, but about our moral responsibility. So whether we accept global warming or climate change or pollution of environment is not the real question, but how we use the elements of nature and our use should not destroy the good creation of God.
