#### Corpus Christí

#### "THIS IS MY BODY. THIS IS MY BLOOD."

#### First Reading: Exodus 24:3-8

To ratify the New Covenant, a solemn rite, as defined by the sacred instruction, is celebrated. A portion of the blood of young bulls is sprinkled on the altar, representing God, and another portion is sprinkled on the people.



#### Second Reading: Hebrews 9:11-15

Jesus' sacrifice of His life gives Him the right to enter the heavenly sanctuary. He thus becomes the mediator of a New Covenant between God and His people.

#### Gospel: Mark 14:12-16, 22-26

The Last Supper is a Passover meal with the setting prearranged by Jesus. In this setting, He institutes both the Eucharist and the priesthood. Mark connects the meal with the heavenly banquet yet to come.

#### THE WORD THIS WEEK



The key to today's readings is the word "Covenant". A Covenant is a solemn and binding agreement between two parties, which establishes the way in which each party will behave towards the other. It establishes rights and duties, and forges a new relationship between two people or groups

of people. In the Ancient World, a Covenant was always sealed with a sacrifice and a meal: the sacrifice brought divine blessing on the covenant, and the meal sealed the relationship between the participants. In the Covenant that God forged with his people in the Old Testament, it was expressed very simply: God said, "You will be my people, and I will be your God." God would remain faithful to the people, and they were to remain faithful to God (this is where the commandments come in). This Covenant was sealed in its greatest form on Mount Sinai, as we hear in the first reading. When the Old Covenant had been broken beyond repair, God sent his only Son to establish a New Covenant: the sacrifice and meal of this New Covenant is Calvary and the Last Supper, where Christ is both priest and victim and altar. When we eat and drink this sacred meal at every Mass we are renewed in the New Covenant and the relationship with God, because Calvary and the Upper Room are present once more and the New Covenant is sealed for us anew.

## Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi)

Moviemakers use them all the time to tell a story. I refer to flashbacks. They give the movie audience a necessary framework and a context with which to understand the story about to unfold.

Today's feast of "Corpus Christi", or "The Body and Blood of Christ", takes us via flashback not only to Holy Thursday night last April but also to the first Holy Thursday night. For us, in the midst of commemorating Holy Week and beginning the Sacred Triduum, our thoughts could not get past such important but lesser events like the Agony in the Garden and the Washing of the Feet, both of those against Jesus' impending death the next day. The hearts of the whole Church were too heavy for a full-fledged celebration of the incomparable gift of the Holy Eucharist. But what a night, and what a gift! For that was when Our Lord first took bread and wine and identified Himself with them. Now, for us, He does the same thing through the ministry of His ordained priests.

With centuries of reflection, the Church acknowledges that this Gift of Himself is too stupendous for a hasty acknowledgement. Historically the feast came about chiefly by the labors of a 13th century Norbertine canoness by the name of Julianna of Liege, Belgium. She urged her local bishop to institute a feast which was later adopted for the universal Church by Pope Urban IV in 1264.

Rather than spend time trying to figure out how the humble elements of bread and wine become the Body and Blood of the living God, it is much more beneficial to reflect on **why** they do. Which is to ask why Jesus so

gifted us, who are so undeserving. In one word, the answer is "love."

We mean "love" in a special sense. Not sentimentality or feelings. Moon-struck gazes of lovers. This is pure love, which is nothing less than a decision of the will of one person for the good of another. That's how Jesus loves us, with no selfish overtones or conditions.

In strictly human terms, the Eucharist is God's decision to continue the creative love that brought us into existence in the first place. He makes this commitment to be present to us along our life's way here below to the heavenly life beyond this one. He nourishes us with the very food and drink we need to get to our goal. He is present on our altars at Mass just as much as He was on the Galilean roadways and the Judaean hillsides, but not in a visible way. We only see Him through the eyes of faith. The bread and wine are not mere symbols but the actual Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity. Nothing less. This is our faith. We are proud to profess it.

This feast becomes an invitation to recall what we have been given as the one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. The Eucharist is, as Vatican II expressed it, "the source and summit of our belief." The Sunday Mass is therefore not just a cold obligation, but our weekly opportunity to reunite warmly with the God Who made us out of nothing but His decision. That's a flashback to remember for a lifetime.
