Second Reading: I John 4:II-I6

The great statement "God is love" appears here, preceded by another declaration, namely that God has loved us. John writes that acknowledging Jesus as God's Son is how we can be sure that God remains in us.

Gospel: John 17:11b-19

Framed as Jesus' Last Supper discourse, the evangelist relates the sending of the Apostles into the world. Jesus prays for them to be protected from "the evil one." He also asks that they be "consecrated in the truth" of their witness to Him.

Dear Friends,

This Sunday we celebrate the feast of the Ascension of the Lord. Forty days after the resurrection, Jesus ascended into heaven in the sight of his disciples. The Acts of the Apostles begins with the recounting of the Ascension of the Lord. Luke describes what happened on that day in this manner. "When they had gathered together they asked him, "Lord, are you at this time going*to restore the kingdom to Israel?" He answered them, "It is not for you to know the times or seasons that the Father has established by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." When he had said this, as they were looking on, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him from their sight."(Acts 1:6-9) Just like Easter, this feast also moves, because it is linked with the day of the Lord's resurrection. It always used to be celebrated on the 40th day of Easter ad it was always a Thursday. Due to the great significance this has in Christian faith, this was designated as a day of obligation and in countries that have a Catholic tradition; this is a holiday and a Holy Day. But in many countries, it is a working day, In order to facilitate greater participation of the faithful in this feast, with the many changes that happened with Vatican II, the Church allowed for this feast to be moved from the Thursday to the following Sunday. This is how we in the United States celebrate the feast on a Sunday.

For these eight months Fr. Carmelo Romanello has been helping us mostly on the weekends with the celebration of a Mass on Sundays. Since he was stationed at St. Thomas University as the chaplain, it was convenient for him and for us. But he is moving from St. Thomas University at the end of May and will not be available to continue to help. I want to thank him for his generous service to our parish. We shall have a simple reception at the parish hall to appreciate and thank him for his service to the parish of Visitation. This will be held on 31st May after the 10 AM Mass. The 31st being the feast of our parish, we will have a simple rosary procession after the IO AM Mass to Our Lady's Gazebo, followed by the reception. This way people from the IO AM and the I2 noon Masses can attend the reception. Please stop by to show your gratitude for his priestly service to our community.

Please mark your calendars for June 7th, when we will have a special workshop, "Treasure Tips: Financial Well-Being – How to Create (and Maintain) a Budget". The flyer in last week's bulletin gave you more information about the same.

Some of you may have already received an invitation to it through an email sent out from the Archdiocese. This workshop is being conducted at my request, for the benefit of our people. Parishioners from the neighboring parishes also have been informed, so that they can take advantage of this. It is conveniently placed on a Sunday between the 10 AM and the I2 noon Masses, so that people from both the Masses can attend. It is to help people to wisely manage their finances. If you are struggling with your family finances, please take the time to attend it. It could turn out to be a great help to you. Please note that it is not about making money, but about managing money. Often the biggest problem many people have is about managing their money properly. There is a false notion that managing money is only for those who have plenty. In truth managing money is for everyone. Whether you make \$1500 or \$15,000 a month, if you learn to manage it well, you will get the maximum out of your income. It is about how to make good plans for the use of your money. It will be conducted by a staff member from the Archdiocesan Development office and a representative from SunTrust Bank. This is not to sell anything, but just to help you.

Finally I want to encourage our people to be generous to the The USCCB has requested a special second collection to help the victims of the earthquake in Nepal. The earthquake of April 25th with a magnitude of 7.8 on Richter scale claimed the lives of more than 8000 people and more than 17000 were injured. The devastation caused by it left hundreds of thousands of people homeless and some of the villages were entirely wiped out. They are not like homes in the US where we have insurance to cover the damages or to rebuild them. They do not have any insurance and depend of the help of others to survive and rebuild. Catholic Relief Services (CRS) is usually one of the first agencies that send relief supplies and aid to natural disaster affected regions. CRS is providing 10,000 families with emergency shelter materials, blankets, water treatment and hygiene kits. Given the scale of the disaster, the agency expects to expand relief activities to additional families. CRS is working with Caritas Nepal to identify the most pressing needs in the hardest hit districts between Kathmandu and Pokhara, and will scale its operations accordingly. We will have a second collection next weekend (May 23/24) to help the victims of the Nepal Hurricane. I pray that our parishioners will show great generosity toward those victims.
