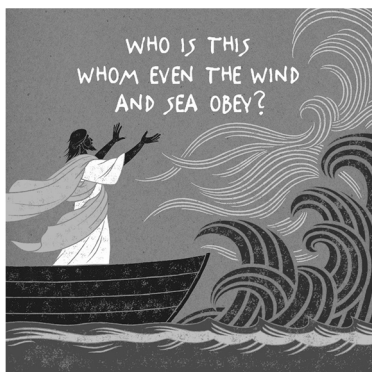

PARISH PILGRIMAGE TO LOURDES

OCT 2-10, 2015

Fr. Peter will be the Spiritual Director of Annunciation’s Pilgrimage to Lourdes, which includes shrines in France, Lissieux (the home of St. Therese the Little Flower), the Rue Du Bac (the shrine of the Miraculous Medal), the shrine of St. Vincent De Paul, Notre Dame Cathedral and Lourdes, as well as many sites of cultural and historical importance (such as the World War II Beaches of Normandy). The cost of the pilgrimage is \$3,450 double or \$4,150 single.
