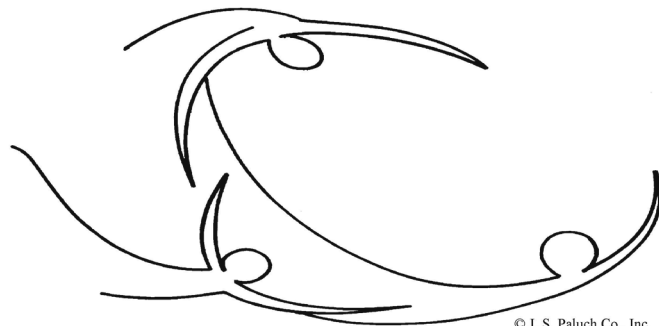

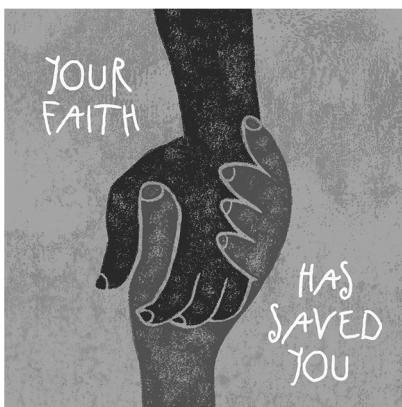

THE LORD OF LIFE



At this bountiful time of year, our Sunday readings teem with life and abundance. Both the first reading, from the book of Wisdom, and the Gospel passage from Mark assure us that God did not make death or even will us to be ill. Illness and death entered the world

through the presence of evil, the Wisdom author tells us. Mark's stories of Jesus healing a hemorrhaging woman and resuscitating a dead little girl make it clear that Jesus is from God. As the Son of God he does not will that anyone suffer illness or death. In the face of such power, the second reading, from Paul's Second Letter to the Corinthians, provides a stark contrast. Jesus, who could raise the dead to new life, "though he was rich, for your sake he became poor" (2 Corinthians 8:9). Our gift of new life from Christ demands our response in charity.

PARISH PILGRIMAGE TO LOURDES

OCT 2-10, 2015

Fr. Peter will be the Spiritual Director of Annunciation's Pilgrimage to Lourdes, which includes shrines in France, Lissieux (the home of St. Therese the Little Flower), the Rue Du Bac (the shrine of the Miraculous Medal), the shrine of St. Vincent De Paul, Notre Dame Cathedral and Lourdes, as well as many sites of cultural and historical importance (such as the World War II Beaches of Normandy). The cost of the pilgrimage is \$3,450 double or \$4,150 single.

**Notification of Hospitalization
 Illness or Impending Surgery**

Hospitals are required to observe confidentiality and privacy laws and are no longer able to inform parishes of admissions of parishioners. It is now necessary for either the patient, him/her self, or a family member to notify the parish of his/her hospitalization. Arrangements then can be made for the parish priest to visit the patient.

Because of privacy laws we do not publish the names of the sick in our bulletin or announce them at Mass unless the patient or a family member gives us permission to do so.

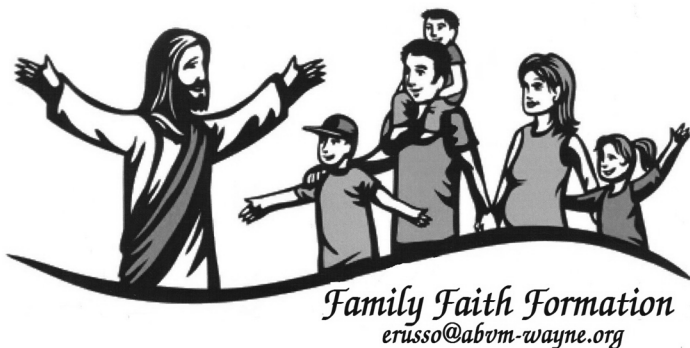
