Everyone is invited & encouraged to attend that Mass, but as parking will be quite limited and very tight, it is strongly suggested that people arrive by bus. #### FAITH AND YOUR FAMILY: Pray

DEFENDING OUR RELIGIOUS LIBERTY: the United States Conference for Catholic Bishops has announced the observance of the fourth annual *Fortnight for Freedom: Freedom to Bear Witness*, from June 21 to July 4, 2015. It is a time when our Liturgical calendar celebrates a series of great Martyrs who remained faithful in the face of persecution by political power— St. Thomas More and St. John Fisher, St. John the Baptist, SS. Peter and Paul, and the First Martyrs of the Church of Rome. The theme of this year's Fortnight will focus on the "freedom to bear witness" to the truth of the Gospel. During *Fortnight for Freedom*, it is important that we consider the reasons why the federal healthcare mandate violates religious freedom and contact our elected officials. The mandate: 1) forces religious insurers to write policies that violate their beliefs; 2) forces religious employees and schools to subsidize and facilitate coverage that violates their beliefs; and 3) forces conscientiously objecting employees and students to purchase coverage that violates their beliefs.

If you haven't done so already, please voice your opposition to the federal health care mandate by calling U.S. Secretary of Health and Human Services Sylvia Mathews Burwell at 202-205-5445, and your elected representatives. Let them know that the mandate is in violation of our First Amendment right to religious freedom.

St. Maria Goretti, Virgin & Martyr July 1



Maria Teresa Goretti was born the 3<sup>rd</sup> of 7 children to Luigi and Assunta Goretti, on October 16, 1890, in Corinaldo, in the Province of Ancona, Italy. When she was 6 years of age, her family relocated to LeFerrieri/Nettuno 50 miles from Rome, where they shared a building with the Serenelli family. Three years later, her father died of Malaria, necessitating that her mother, brothers and sister work the fields, leaving Maria to cook, clean, sew, and watch over her youngest sibling.

On July 5, 1902, 11 y/o Maria was sitting on the outside step of their home sewing, when the son of their co-tenant-Alessandro-who was working out in the field returned to the house threatening to kill her if she did not do what he wanted. Maria refused him protesting that what he wanted to do was a *Mortal sin*, warning that he would go to Hell. She desperately fought him from raping here. She kept screaming: "NO, It is a sin! GOD does not want it!" He first choked her, but when she insisted she would rather die than submit to him, he stabbed her eleven times. Injured, she tried to reach the door, but he stopped her by stabbing her three more times before running away.

Her young sibling awoke with the noise and started crying and when her mother and Alessandro's father came to check on her, they found Maria on the floor bleeding; they took her to the nearsest hospital at Nettuno-Neptune.

She underwent surgery without anesthesia, but her injuries were beyond the doctors' help. Halfway through the surgery, she woke up. She insisted that it stay that way. The Pharmacist said to her: "Maria, think of me in Paradise." She looked at him: "Well, who knows, which of us is going to be there first? You, Maria" he replied. "Then I will gladly think of you," she said. She also expressed concern for her mother's welfare. The following day-24 hours after the attack-having expressed forgiveness for Alessandro and stating that she wanted to have him in Heaven with her Maria Goretti died of her injuries, while looking at a picture of the Virgin Mary, and clutching a Cross to her chest.

After his arrest and Confession, Alessandro deeply regretted his action & asked Maria's mother forgiveness, which she gave, saying "if Maria forgave you, who am I to withold it." He detailed the account of the attack.
