

THE SECOND COLLECTION: this weekend is the Diocesan Missionary Collection seeking to end poverty in many ravaged areas of the world.

SYNOD MASS: The Diocesan Synod which began in September of 2014 to address issues of the Faith in the Diocese will conclude with a Mass on Saturday, September 19<sup>th</sup>, at 11:00 am at Webster Bank Arena in Bridgeport. It is the wish of the bishop to fill the 9,000 seat arena with parishioners from every parish. Everyone is invited & encouraged to attend that Mass, but as parking will be quite limited and very tight, it is strongly suggested that people arrive by bus. Please plan on joining the Faithful of the Diocese in their witness to the spiritual and pastoral life of the Diocese. Although nothing is mentioned of the parents of Our Lady, Mary-'the Holy Theotokos'-in the Sacred Scrolls and Epistles of the New Testament, according to Apocryphal Literature, viz., the "Proto-Evangelion of St. James," the names of Our Lady's parents are Joachim (Hebrew: "God has set up,") and Hannah-Anna (Hebrew: "Grace.")

Accordingly, Joachim was of the tribe of Judah and a descendant of King David; he was a wealthy & pious man who gave 1/3 of his wealth to the Temple at Sepphoris, 1/3 to the poor, and subsisted on 1/3. His wife Hanna was the daughter of Matthan the Priest of the tribe of Levi of the house of Aaron the High Priest-the brother of Moses. He had 3 daughters: Mary, Zoia, and Hanna. Mary was married in Bethlehem & bore Salome; Zoia was also married in Bethlehem & bore Elizabeth-the mother of St. John the Baptist; and, Hanna, who was married to Joachim in Nazareth-who bore the Holy Virgin Mary.

Joachim and Hanna had been married 50 years. They were pious Jews who practiced charity & alms-giving; they had longed for a child but remained childless until their old age. When they went up to Jerusalem to offer sacrifice, the High Priest Issachar reproached Joachim refusing to accept his sacrificial offering because he had no offspring and was considered unworthy. Upon consulting the genealogical records of the tribes of Israel, Joachim was shocked to find he was the only righteous man to be childless. When they returned to their home, Joachim took his flocks up a high mountain to escape his shame, while Hanna remained home in prayer. The Angel Gabriel was sent to both of them announcing that they would bear: "a daughter of Israel most blessed by whom all the nations of the Earth will be blessed, and through whom would come the Salvation of the world." Upon hearing this news, they both promised to have their child raised in the Temple as a holy vessel of God. At age 3, they took Mary to the Temple to be dedicated to the Service of the Lord, and presented her to the Priest Zechariahs. After offering the sacrifice, they returned home, leaving Mary to the Maidens of the Temple, where she grew in grace and prayer.
