A note from the Pastor

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

The efforts that the Church has made throughout the centuries to bring the Good News of the Gospel to all the nations have been often challenged by persecutions, obstacles, and resistances of any kind. Nevertheless, the Church has always declared herself *missionary* by her very nature: the work of evangelization has to continue and be supported by all the faithful; we must pray for and contribute to the missionary activity of the Church in any measure we can.

It is not coincidental that *World Mission Sunday* is celebrated in October, a month traditionally dedicated to Mary and especially to the prayer of the Rosary. Last Sunday Pope Francis consecrated the whole world to Our Lady, on the anniversary of her last apparition in Fatima. This special consecration – following similar ones done in the past by Pope Pius XII and Blessed John Paul II – highlights a situation of spread "incredulity", a *crisis of faith*, present everywhere at different levels. The Pope is acknowledging, and once again stressing, the need for a renewed evangelization in every place: he is urging us to offer ourselves to the Lord through Mary, so that He may make us missionary by the gift of the Holy Spirit.

Mary has actually been described by many as the *first* missionary. Immediately after accepting the announcement that she would become the mother of the Lord, Mary ran to the house of her cousin Elizabeth. She went to share a Good News; she did that by carrying Jesus in her very being; she made the recipients of that news rejoice and begin a new life.

This is then what evangelization is all about: to bring joyfully and freely to others the Gospel of Christ that we have first received, and to which we have given our free and joyful adherence. It's all about giving others the key to a treasure that gives meaning to our existence, whatever our condition or situation of life may be.

But evangelization is also something we should *learn* about. Even the Virgin Mary – the handmaid of the Lord, the mother of God – had to become a follower and disciple: she attended the *school* of Jesus from the moment of his birth all the way to his passion, death, resurrection and ascension into Heaven! The best way to celebrate World Mission Sunday is therefore to put Christ once again at the center of our life, look to the life of the saints and teachers of the Church, and ... *believe!*
