#### OUR PASTOR'S MESSAGE Fourth Week of Lent: "God so loved the world..."

Nicodemus appears three times in the Gospel of John. In chapter three, Nicodemus is a Pharisee or Jewish leader who recognizes that Jesus is a teacher sent from heaven. In chapter seven, Nicodemus advises the Pharisees to listen to Jesus before passing judgment on him. And in chapter nineteen, Nicodemus provides the aloes and myrrh to embalm Jesus after the crucifixion. After the resurrection, tradition holds that Nicodemus was one of the first Christians. In fact, Nicodemus is venerated as both a saint and martyr for the faith.

In this weekend's Gospel reading, even though Jesus predicts his passion, death, and resurrection, Nicodemus does not yet believe that Jesus is the Messiah. Then suddenly, the narrator offers what has become one of the most famous and recognizable passages in scripture: "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but have eternal life (John 3:16)." One Christian commentator has written that this verse contains the whole "gospel in a nutshell."

Indeed, this famous passage contains essential truths about God and his relationship with us: God loves us; God sacrifices his Son for our sake; and God makes this sacrifice so that we might live with Him for all eternity. We know these things as basic components of our shared faith. But do we ever really pause and consider their momentous impact on our lives? Do we ever stop and think how much God loves us, how much God sacrifices for us, and how much God desires to be with us for all eternity?

If you are a parent or grandparent, then you know about the intense love that a parent feels for a child. And if you know how much a parent loves a child, then just imagine the intensity of God's divine and eternal love for Jesus. As human parents, we are imperfect, but God is truly perfect. As human children, we are imperfect, but Jesus is truly perfect. Because we are sinners, it is impossible for us to truly measure God's boundless love for his only Son. But wait, there's more!

Consider now the essential truth that God loves us (you and me) so much that he willingly sacrifices Jesus, his only Son, for our sake! Despite our brokenness, God surrenders Jesus to the world and its torments so that we (you and me) might one day join him in heaven! Through the life, death, and resurrection of Christ Jesus, God reaches down from the heavens and holds us (you and me) in an embrace that will last forever and ever.

As our Lenten journey continues, let us pray for the courage and grace to truly surrender ourselves to God's endless love and mercy. "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but have eternal life." Amen!

## THE ASSISI PROJECT Eighth Annual Fall Pilgrimage October 30th-November 7th

In 2015, for the eighth consecutive year, Father Jim, Cliff Garvey, and the Assisi Project will lead a week-long, small -group pilgrimage and retreat to Assisi, Italy from October 30th through November 7th.

Last year, a group of sixteen pilgrims literally walked in the footsteps of Saint Francis and Saint Clare of Assisi. This year, we will journey back to some of the world's most compelling pilgrimage sites in Assisi, La Verna, and the Rieti Valley.

Each morning of our pilgrimage will begin with Morning Prayer and Mass. Our Masses will be celebrated at the Church of San Damiano, the Basilica of Saint Francis, the Basilica of Saint Clare, and the Porziuncola. Each afternoon, our pilgrims will have free time to explore the medieval city of Assisi at their own pace and to visit the countless churches, cafes, museums, and shops. Each evening, our group will gather for Evening Prayer, and a period of faith formation, discussion, and faith sharing.

As a fellowship of pilgrims, we will visit the historic basilicas of Saint Francis and Saint Clare, which contain the tombs of the saints, holy relics, and priceless works of art. But these basilicas are not museums. They are pilgrimage sites for prayer, meditation, and worship. We will visit the Basilica of Saint Rufino, where Saint Francis and Saint Clare were baptized. We will visit the Church of Saint Damian, where the famous crucifix spoke to Francis and hastened his conversion. And we will visit the chapel known as the Porziuncola or "Little Portion" which is the home church of the worldwide Franciscan family.

Finally, we will travel to La Verna, the mountain sanctuary in Tuscany, where Saint Francis received the Stigmata (the five wounds of the Crucified Christ). We will also journey to the Rieti Valley: to Greccio (where Saint Francis created the world's first Christmas crèche) and to Fonte Colombo (where Saint Francis wrote his Rule under the guidance and inspiration of an angel).

The cost of this extraordinary small-group pilgrimage is just \$3,299 and includes air fare and associated fees and taxes (from Boston's Logan Airport); guest house accommodations (single room) in Assisi; and ground transportation to and from the airport and to and from all scheduled pilgrimage sites in Italy. All meals are included. The price does not include the costs of highly recommended travel insurance (approximately \$250) or personal taxi services in and around the medieval city of Assisi.

As all of us already know, "Disciples in Mission" is the title of the Archdiocesan Pastoral Planning Commission's proposal that created the Catholic Community of Gloucester & Rockport, a collaborative of Holy Family Parish and Our Lady of Good Voyage Parish.

That pastoral plan states: "Disciples in Mission seeks to revitalize the Catholic Church in Boston by positioning our parishes more solidly for the task of evangelization, the work of reaching out to our brothers and sisters and drawing them more fully to Christ Jesus."

Over the course of the past nine months, our two parishes have made good progress — praying and working together as a Catholic community united in prayer, fellowship, and service. But of course, much work remains to be done! Part of that work is an honest self-assessment of where we've been, where we are, and where we're headed as communities of faith.

The survey can be completed in approximately ten minutes either online (at ccgronline.com) or by completing one of the printed surveys that are available in both our pastoral office and in the vestibules of our churches.

Led by Father Jim, our pastoral team is working hard to help you grow in faith and to nurture your personal relationship with Christ Jesus. Your honest feedback will be a great gift to both the Catholic Community of Gloucester & Rockport and to the Catholic Church throughout the world. So, please help us help you by completing the Disciple Maker Index as soon as possible.
