Our Pastor's Message

OUR NEW WORSHIP SCHEDULE: A TIME FOR PRAYER & DISCERNMENT

Last weekend, sixty-eight of our youngest fellow parishioners from both Holy Family Parish and Our Lady of Good Voyage Parish received the Body & Blood of Christ for the first time. These annual celebrations of First Holy Communion are a time of great joy for our students, for their parents and families, and for our parishes.

For me and for the Catholic Community of Gloucester & Rockport, this time of great blessing and joy also has been a time for much prayer and discernment. During the past month, we have had much to pray about. First, Father Al Puccinelli has accepted a new pastoral assignment back in Brazil where he had served for many years before joining our community. Second, it is now clear that I will be the only priest assigned full-time to our two parishes. And finally, although we are very grateful for their help, our two senior priests are already doing what they can in retirement to help serve our two parishes.

In recent weeks, I have consulted with our pastoral team, both of our parish councils, our finance councils, many of our fellow parishioners, and representatives from all of our parish ministries and organizations about the need for a new weekend worship schedule. Their good advice, wise counsel, and generosity of spirit were invaluable in helping me to pray, discern, and decide how best to balance the pastoral needs of our parish communities and the pastoral and priestly resources available to us at this time.

This new schedule (see right) will begin during the weekend of May 30th-May 31st. My hope and prayer is that this schedule, which reflects the shared sacrifice of both parishes, will continue to build, deepen, and strengthen the growing collaboration between Holy Family Parish and Our Lady of Good Voyage Parish. As I share this new worship schedule with you, I am reminded of the parishioner who recently told me that wherever Jesus goes, she will follow. I hope that you will join her and me on this challenging journey of faith, hope, and love!

Two weeks ago, we learned that Father Michael McLellan, Pastor of Saint John the Evangelist in Canton, died suddenly at the start of Mass last Sunday morning. Father Mike was just 64 years old. He was a good and faithful priest who dedicated his life to serving God's Church throughout the Archdiocese of Boston. He will be greatly missed. Please pray for him and his grieving parish!

As our journey continues, please pray for me, for Father Alves and Father Gariboldi, for all of our brother priests who devote their lives to the people of God, and for all who live, work, and worship in the Catholic Community of Gloucester & Rockport! Thank you!

This Week's Message

A MOTHER'S DAY REFLECTION

My parents celebrated their fiftieth wedding anniversary late last year. Since then, I have been thinking a lot about them — especially my mom. She came of age during the 1960's, a turbulent time in our nation's history. She married her high school sweetheart. In less than a year, she went from being someone's daughter, to being someone's wife, to being someone's mother. Her husband survived Vietnam. She lost a brother in Vietnam. She and my dad struggled to buy a house and make ends meet. And all around us, the world was changing — that seemingly endless war, the cultural revolution, and the sexual revolution. It was not an easy life. And it was not an easy time to be married or to raise a child.

At so many points during their five decades together, my parents could have called it quits. But unlike so many others in our family and so many others of their generation, they remained together. It was not easy, but their love and their marriage endured. For better or worse. For richer or poorer. In sickness and in health. In retirement now, my parents seem truly content and happy. It is a beautiful thing to watch and share with them. And I pray that they remain healthy for many years to come.

My mom is an amazing person. Unlike my dad and me, she makes friends easily, loves easily, forgives easily, and is generous and loyal almost beyond belief. She never holds a grudge. She has close friends from infancy and kindergarten. She sends and receives dozens (if not hundreds) of cards for birthdays and holidays each year. If someone she loves is sick or grieving, she is the one who visits when others have lost hope, interest, or patience.

My mom is not a saint. Like you and me, she has faults. She makes mistakes. She sometimes makes me crazy. But something beautiful and holy has happened between us. I now see in my mom qualities that so many of us see in our prayerful devotion to the Blessed Mother: boundless courage, devotion, faith, and perseverance.

When I think of Our Blessed Mother, I think of her as the mother who stood and wept at the foot of the cross. When others had fled, Mary stayed and wept as her son suffered. Of course, nothing so horrific has ever happened to me. But no matter what, my mom has forgiven me, loved me, sacrificed for me, and stood by me through every challenge, every failure, and every mistake. They say that the bond between mother and son is unbreakable. Our faith teaches us that. Experience teaches me that, too.

This Mother's Day, let us thank God for our mothers; let us ask God to bless them, protect them, and strengthen them; and let us ask for the grace to love our moms like they love us — beyond all measure. Amen!

Fall Pilgrimage 2015

ASSISI PROJECT FALL PILGRIMAGE Only Three Spaces Remaining!

For the eighth consecutive year, Father Jim, Cliff Garvey, and the Assisi Project are sponsoring a week-long, small group pilgrimage to Assisi, Italy from October 30th through November 7th. Last year, a group of sixteen pilgrims literally walked in the footsteps of Saint Francis and Saint Clare of Assisi. This year, we will journey back to some of the world's most holy pilgrimage sites in Assisi, La Verna, and the Rieti Valley.

Each morning, our pilgrims will begin with breakfast, followed by Morning Prayer and Mass. Our Masses will be celebrated at the Church of San Damiano, the Porziuncola, and Basilicas of Saint Francis and Saint Clare. Each afternoon, the pilgrims will have the free time and guidance to explore the medieval city of Assisi at their own pace and to visit the countless churches, cafes, museums, and shops. Each evening, we will gather for supper, Evening Prayer, and a period of faith formation and fellowship.

As a fellowship of pilgrims, we will visit the historic Basilicas of Saint Francis and Saint Clare. Each of these great basilicas contains the tombs of the saints, holy relics, and priceless works of art. But these basilicas are also places for prayer, silent meditation, and worship. We will visit the Basilica of Saint Rufino, where Francis and Clare were baptized; the Church of Saint Damian, where the famous crucifix spoke to Francis; and the little chapel known as the Porziuncola, which is considered the home church of the worldwide Franciscan community.

In addition, we will spend leisurely afternoons in and around the Piazza del Commune, Assisi's city center, with its ancient Roman temple (now a Catholic church), sidewalk cafes, restaurants, and shops. The more adventurous will also have an opportunity to visit the Rocca Maggiore, the great medieval fortress with its stunning views of Assisi, the Spoleto Valley, and Mount Subasio.

Finally, we will travel to La Verna, the mountain sanctuary in Tuscany, where Saint Francis received the stigmata (five wounds of the Crucified Christ). At La Verna, we will celebrate Mass, enjoy a delicious lunch, and participate in the daily procession that commemorates how Saint Francis received the stigmata. We will also travel to Greccio (where Francis created the first live nativity scene) and to Fonte Columbo (where Francis wrote his rule under the guidance of an angel).

The cost of this extraordinary pilgrimage is just \$3,299 and includes air fare and associated fees; guest house accommodations, and ground transportation (except personal taxi services).
