Bringing Home the Word

GUEST MESSAGE THE ULTIMATE UNBALANCED FORCE

A year ago, I spent some time in India. One evening, my hostess invited me to watch “The Bucket List” (a movie starring Morgan Freeman and Jack Nicholson) with her. Try to picture us: two women, one Hindu and one Catholic, unknown to each other until a month earlier, watching a movie about two men with terminal cancer who spend their last six months doing things they always wanted to do before they “kick the bucket.” Poonam and I sat late into the night discussing our own “bucket lists” and found we had much in common.

What do I want to do before I die? For that matter, what do I want to do before summer ends? Too often it flies by, and come September, I mourn that I only went swimming twice with my grandchildren; I missed the cherry harvest; and I didn’t even begin a certain writing project.

Why do we not do what we want to do? This phenomenon isn’t limited to distasteful projects. It’s not so much the work that’s daunting, it’s the starting. I don’t have a scientific mind, but when I was introduced to Isaac Newton’s First Law of Motion, I had an “aha” moment. The first part says that a body at rest or moving at a constant speed in a straight line will remain at rest or keep moving in a straight line at constant speed. Aha! That’s why it’s so hard to get going or to change. We’re like Newton’s inanimate objects, tending to continue as we are — purposeful and productive or on the couch watching reruns of “This Old House.”

This morning in our coffee shop, I met a good friend who just lost his job, one of the millions of the suddenly unemployed. After years of the work routine, he’s verging on despair. Financial worries, yes, but also difficult is the disorientation of being forced to a sudden stop. And yet crises that bring us up short are also moments of opportunity, moments when we can examine who we are, what we want from life or — better — what God wants of us.

The cure for boredom and mindless distraction by day and wide-eyed, heart-thumping panic by night is engagement: the flow and competence of meaningful work. But sometimes a malaise settles over a person suddenly out of work, and it’s hard to get going again. As Newton explained in the second part of his First Law of Motion, the events in the first part only change when they’re acted upon by an “unbalanced force.”

What is an unbalanced force? Any force strong enough to get us moving in a new direction...or moving at all. Job loss, being diagnosed with cancer, and retirement are unbalanced forces that compel us to move in a new direction, but sometimes a New Year’s resolution or a “bucket list” will do the trick, too.

The ultimate unbalanced force, the force that can knock us off our pins and set us right again, is the Holy Spirit. God didn’t create us to be slaves to safe routines and mindless amusements until this precious life is over. He made us for freedom and instilled in us a longing for meaning, a sense that our lives matter very much. We’re here to reveal, indeed, to be, a face of God otherwise never known to this world. God sends the Holy Spirit to work in us, to help each of us become our true self before his life ends and we go home to heaven. Meanwhile, the summer stretches before us. What’s on your list of things to do before the summer kicks the bucket?

**OUR NEW WORSHIP SCHEDULE:
THE PRODUCT OF PRAYER & DISCERNMENT**

The just concluded Easter season was a time of great joy in the Catholic Community of Gloucester & Rockport. In large numbers, parishioners, friends, and guests from both Holy Family Parish and Our Lady of Good Voyage Parish turned out to celebrate our first Triduum together. We celebrated both the Sacrament of Confirmation and the Sacrament of First Holy Communion. And last weekend, we celebrated Father Gariboldi's 80th birthday!

This season of Easter joy was also bittersweet — tempered by sad news and difficult decisions. Father Al Pucinelli was reassigned back to Brazil. Because of the shortage of priests, we did not receive a parochial vicar. And although we are deeply grateful for their help, our senior priests are already doing what they can in retirement to help serve the needs of our parishes.

During this period, I consulted with our pastoral team, parish councils, finance councils, fellow parishioners, and representatives from all of our parish ministries and organizations about the need for a new worship schedule. Their good advice, wise counsel, and generous spirits were invaluable in helping me to pray, discern, and decide how best to balance the pastoral needs of our two parishes and the priestly resources available at this time.

Our new worship schedule (see left) is the product of this period of intense prayer and discernment. My hope and prayer is that this schedule, which reflects the shared sacrifice of both parishes, will continue to build, deepen, and strengthen the growing collaboration between Holy Family Parish and Our Lady of Good Voyage Parish. As we begin this new schedule, I am reminded again of the parishioner who told me that wherever Jesus goes, she will follow. I hope that you will join her and me on this ongoing journey of faith, hope, and love for the Risen Lord!

As we begin our second year together as the Catholic Community of Gloucester & Rockport, I will have much to share with you about where we've been, where we are, and where we're headed. Until then, please accept my most sincere thanks for your encouragement, your friendship, your prayers, and your support. I continue to be both heartened and humbled by the good and faithful people of our two parishes.

As our journey continues, please pray for me, for Father Alves and Father Gariboldi, for our pastoral team, for all of our volunteers, and for all who live, work, and worship in the Catholic Community of Gloucester & Rockport! Thank you! May God bless you — now and always!

Fall Pilgrimage 2015

ASSISI PROJECT FALL PILGRIMAGE Only One Space Remaining!

For the eighth consecutive year, Father Jim, Cliff Garvey, and the Assisi Project are sponsoring a week-long, small group pilgrimage to Assisi, Italy from October 30th through November 7th. Last year, a group of sixteen pilgrims literally walked in the footsteps of Saint Francis and Saint Clare of Assisi. This year, we will journey back to some of the world's most holy pilgrimage sites in Assisi, La Verna, and the Rieti Valley.

Each morning, our pilgrims will begin with breakfast, followed by Morning Prayer and Mass. Our Masses will be celebrated at the Church of San Damiano, the Porziuncola, and Basilicas of Saint Francis and Saint Clare. Each afternoon, the pilgrims will have the free time and guidance to explore the medieval city of Assisi at their own pace and to visit the countless churches, cafes, museums, and shops. Each evening, we will gather for supper, Evening Prayer, and a period of faith formation and fellowship.

As a fellowship of pilgrims, we will visit the historic Basilicas of Saint Francis and Saint Clare. Each of these great basilicas contains the tombs of the saints, holy relics, and priceless works of art. But these basilicas are also places for prayer, silent meditation, and worship. We will visit the Basilica of Saint Rufino, where Francis and Clare were baptized; the Church of Saint Damian, where the famous crucifix spoke to Francis; and the little chapel known as the Porziuncola, which is considered the home church of the worldwide Franciscan community.

In addition, we will spend leisurely afternoons in and around the Piazza del Comune, Assisi's city center, with its ancient Roman temple (now a Catholic church), sidewalk cafes, restaurants, and shops. The more adventurous will also have an opportunity to visit the Rocca Maggiore, the great medieval fortress with its stunning views of Assisi, the Spoleto Valley, and Mount Subasio.

Finally, we will travel to La Verna, the mountain sanctuary in Tuscany, where Saint Francis received the stigmata (five wounds of the Crucified Christ). At La Verna, we will celebrate Mass, enjoy a delicious lunch, and participate in the daily procession that commemorates how Saint Francis received the stigmata. We will also travel to Greccio (where Francis created the first live nativity scene) and to Fonte Columbo (where Francis wrote his rule under the guidance of an angel).

The cost of this extraordinary pilgrimage is just \$3,299 and includes air fare and associated fees; guest house accommodations, and ground transportation (except personal taxi services).
