

# Father Sam's Message

This Sunday, we joyfully celebrate the Solemnity of All Saints. As Catholics, we are so blessed to know the reality of heaven. In the history of the Church, we have so many real examples of men, women, and children who, through the Blood of the Lamb, have certainly received the crown of eternal glory in heaven. This feast confirms for us the truth that we too are made for a heavenly destiny and encourages us to "keep our eyes on the prize." Regarding our heavenly calling, St. John tells us in the 2<sup>nd</sup> reading, "See what love the Father has bestowed on us that we may be called the children of God. Yet so we are" (1 John 3:1). In their lives on earth, the saints profoundly experienced, eagerly lived out, and generously shared the infinite love God has for them. The saints deeply desired heaven not for the immeasurable joy and peace a person receives in this most blessed state, but because they would be eternally united with the One whom they loved with their whole heart, whole strength, and whole soul.



In doing everything they could to conform themselves to the will of Father in imitation of Jesus and in their humble acceptance of the inevitable trials of the earthly life, the saints' hearts were purified from any and all self-

centered motives. Their priority and primary focus in life was to love God and to love others as Christ loves. St. John writes, "Everyone who has this hope based on him makes himself pure, as he is pure" (1 John 3:3). So, their fidelity and strength, which is required to be a saint, is motived by a pure love of God, purity of heart and mind. Saints are not wimps or weaklings. On the contrary, they received superhuman courage provided by the grace of God. For love of God, they overcame sin in their lives and help others to do the same. With trust in God's infinite mercy, they fearlessly confronted their own sins and fully accepted His forgiveness. Some people don't ever think of their sins while others, perhaps, dwell too much on their sins. The saints had the right balance. They admitted and acknowledged their sins, but then let our Lord Jesus, who is the Lamb of God, take their sins away. Because sin is a betrayal that breaks the bond of love, the saints, of course, resolved and really worked at not sinning again, even not to commit the smallest of This week's first reading from the Book of Revelation states, "These are the ones who have survived the time of great distress; they have washed their robes and made them white in the Blood of the Lamb" (Rev. 4). In the Sacrament of Baptism, we have already received our robe made "white in the Blood of the Lamb," and to maintain or restore this sign of Christian perfection and purity, we have been given the Sacrament of Penance, Confession.

We can learn from the saints what is really important in life, the real meaning of life. The saints spent their lives striving and growing in the perfect love of God. Perhaps we spend way too much of our precious time and energy pursuing earthly comforts and pleasures. We allow ourselves to fret and become anxious over trivial matters. Compared to the beauty and joy of being in union with God in heaven, everything we could ever experience on earth, including any type of suffering, seems really small. St. Paul confirms this in his 2<sup>nd</sup> letter to the Corinthians when he writes, "For momentary, light affliction is producing for us an eternal weight of glory far beyond all comparison, while we look not at the things which are seen, but at the things which are not seen; for the things which are seen are temporal, but the things which are not seen are eternal" (2 Cor. 4:17-18). Also, the great Spanish Mystic, St. Teresa of Avila said, "Looked at from the viewpoint of heaven, the most horribly painful earthly life will turn out to be no more than one night in an inconvenient hotel." Those who are saints really understood this truth and looked forward with great anticipation to the goal of heaven.

Being a saint is simple but not easy. It is simple because all we have to do is love as we are made and meant to love, but it is not easy because we know our weakness and many failings. To be a saint is impossible on our own. We are totally and completely depended on God's grace. But with God's grace, all things are possible! He has given us everything we need, particularly the fullness of Truth taught by His Church, the Sacred Scriptures, the Sacraments, and the examples of saints who have shown us it is possible to be holy and grow in perfect love. Therefore, we have confidence, with His constant help, we can endeavor in everything we do to be saints, not just average saints, but GREAT saints!

We ask for the intercession of the saints, particularly the Queen of Saints, the Blessed Virgin Mary, and our patron, St. Patrick, that we too can enjoy the eternal joy and peace that comes from union with God in heaven after our earthly trial. **NOVEMBER 1, 2015 ALL SAINTS** 






