Father Sam's Message

On behalf of our entire parish family, I want to sincerely thank everyone who made last week's Christmas Festival a great success. As a result of your generosity and the hard work of many people, the parish collected \$15,387! We are still finalizing the expenses, including the cash prizes as part of the Grand Prize raffle, but it looks like we are going to clear over \$12,000. First of all, I would like to thank all of you who attended this special event. I was very impressed and appreciative of how much work many of our fellow parishioners undertook to plan, prepare, and run the festival. To set up the hall, which ended up being packed with hundreds of donated items, took two full days alone. This does not include the many hours it takes to catalogue and price all the donated items. A number of parishioners sacrificed a Saturday helping run the booths, some staying at the event all day. In addition to the financial benefits to the parish, events such as the Christmas Festival help bring us closer together as a parish. When I was there on Saturday, I felt a positive energy and was blessed to have met a number of new people. For next year's festival, I would like to invite even more of our parishioners to actively participate. Again, for those of you who donated, planned, set up, worked, and took down our Christmas Festival, I want to express my gratitude for your generosity. Thank you and may God continue to bless you!

This Sunday, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. We give praise, honor, and thanksgiving to our Lord Jesus, who is truly our King. As Americans, we do not



easily relate to the experience of being governed by a monarchy. Our nation was founded, at least partly, on the idea that a monarchy, being ruled by only one person, as a form of government is a bad idea. As a result of our rejecting the rule of a king, we have distrust of this form of authority. In some ways, these suspicions are justified because throughout human history we have seen many examples of corrupt, cruel, and oppressive kings. However, we should remember that not every monarchy is bad, just as not every democracy is good. Although a monarchy is not the only way to order human society, it is a vivid reflection of how the entire cosmos is ultimately governed by the supreme authority of One. Of course, the supreme authority is God.

This Solemnity of acknowledging Jesus as our King may not have as much significance to us if we don't understand or have the experience of what it means to be ruled by a king. In the past, the king was the one and only person whom everyone, from the poorest to the richest, looked to for security, justice, and keeping of the social order to meet the needs of all. Because of the indispensable role of the king, the greatest honor, respect, and obedience was owed to the monarch. In fact, everything depended upon him or her. Without the king, this single person, the whole social order would fall apart, descending into anarchy and chaos. This feast reminds us if we fail to acknowledge the reverence and honor owed to our Lord and King, Jesus Christ and do not remain faithful to His commandments, the order of our lives will fall apart. The honor, reverence, and obedience we owe to Jesus is exhibited in how we listen to Him, who is Truth. He tells in the Gospel of John, "You say I am a king. For this I was born and for this I came into the world, to testify to the truth. Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice." We faithfully belong to His kingdom, a kingdom of eternal peace, justice, and joy, when we listen to His "voice." We hear the voice of our King, the voice of Truth, when we listen and follow the teachings of the Church. If we do not obey the Church's teachings, which are Christ the King's teachings, then we disrespect and dishonor our King and our lives will slide into chaos and darkness.

With the help of our Queen Mother, the Blessed Virgin Mary, let us continue to listen to our one and only Supreme Ruler, our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe.


The Knights of Columbus hosted a delicious quiche breakfast followed by our fantastic Hispanic group's famous burritos, tostadas and quesadillas.




