
Father Sam's Message

We have now begun the holy season of Advent in preparation of the most joyous birth of Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior. In this special

readv ourselves time. we to encounter the fullness of God's love for each one of us. The holy infant born to a young virgin, in a humble stable in Bethlehem, is truly God's love and mercy in the flesh. In Jesus, we see, hear, and touch God's mercy and forgiveness. Over the course of this new liturgical year, which begins this Sunday, you will be hearing much more about God's mercy. This fundamental attribute of God is experienced through the gift of our

Faith. As His children, God desires for each of us to know His infinite mercy and then share His mercy with the world. We, who have undeservedly received God's mercy by our Lord Jesus' life, death, and resurrection, are obliged to generously show, or make real, His mercy for others, especially the poor, the sick, and those who suffer. In order for the Church and the world to have a greater understanding and experience of God's mercy, our Holy Father, Pope Francis, has declared this next liturgical year as the "Year of Mercy." Below, I have included the first three articles from the Holy Father's "Bull of Indiction," called Misericordiae Vultus, declaring the Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy, which officially begins on December 8th.

"1. Jesus Christ is the face of the Father's mercy. These words might well sum up the mystery of the Christian faith. Mercy has become living and visible in Jesus of Nazareth, reaching its culmination in him. The Father, "rich in mercy" (*Eph* 2:4), after having revealed his name to Moses as "a God merciful and gracious, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness" (*Ex* 34:6), has never ceased to show, in various ways throughout history, his divine nature. In the "fullness of time" (*Gal* 4:4), when everything had been arranged according to his plan of salvation, he sent his only Son into the world, born of the Virgin Mary, to reveal his love for us in a definitive way. Whoever



sees Jesus sees the Father (cf. *Jn* 14:9). Jesus of Nazareth, by his words, his actions, and his entire person [1] reveals the mercy of God.

2. We need constantly to contemplate the mystery of mercy. It is a wellspring of joy, serenity, and peace. Our salvation depends on it. Mercy: the word reveals the very mystery of the Most Holy Trinity. Mercy: the ultimate and supreme act by which God comes to meet us. Mercy: the fundamental law that dwells in the heart of every person who looks sincerely into the eyes of his brothers and sisters on the path of life. Mercy: the bridge that

connects God and man, opening our hearts to the hope of being loved forever despite our sinfulness.

3. At times we are called to gaze even more attentively on mercy so that we may become a more effective sign of the Father's action in our lives. For this reason I have proclaimed an *Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy* as a special time for the Church, a time when the witness of believers might grow stronger and more effective.

The Holy Year will open on 8 December 2015, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception. This liturgical feast day recalls God's action from the very beginning of the history of mankind. After the sin of Adam and Eve, God did not wish to leave humanity alone in the throes of evil. And so he turned his gaze to Mary, holy and immaculate in love (cf. *Eph* 1:4), choosing her to be the Mother of man's Redeemer. When faced with the gravity of sin, God responds with the fullness of mercy. Mercy will always be greater than any sin, and no one can place limits on the love of God who is ever ready to forgive."

Let us pray, through the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Mother of Mercy, that during this extraordinary jubilee year we will grow in an ever-deeper awareness of and have a more profound response to God's mercy, Jesus Christ, who becomes one of us!
