#### WELCOME TO ST. PATRICK'S CATHOLIC CHURCH



tarting this Sunday, we will be hearing a series of Gospel readings from what is referred to as the "Bread of Life Discourse." Taken from the sixth chapter of the Gospel of John, these 50 or so Scripture verses are the most clear and direct teaching of our Jesus on the mystery of the Eucharist, the Bread of The discourse is appropriately Life. heralded by the miracle we hear about today - a multiplication of loaves and fish at which our Lord Jesus feeds "about five thousand" with only "five barley loaves and two fish." In this miracle, we are reminded of our Lord's concern, love, and care for each of us, His sheep. The large crowd came to a place where there was no food to seek out Jesus and be with Because they sought Him and Him.

forgot their own concerns, they received the reward of God feeding them and bringing them together as one. Because food is necessary to sustain and grow, it is a symbol for life. The feeding of the vast crowd by our Lord shows us the new life God desires for us. We have already received a share in God's life in our baptism, and we continue to grow in it through the Sacrament of the Eucharist. In addition to representing life, the food shared among all who received it at our Lord's miracle also shows unity. But real unity is more than simply eating together in the same place or even at the same table. Unity is a sharing in the Truth, the experience of God's love for us. So, those who received at that deserted place were united not because they ate food together, but because they shared in the Truth of Christ's love for them. This unity is the same for us when we share God's love in the Eucharist united with all the members of the Body of Christ, the Church, who share in the one Truth.

Participation in God's life means being united with God, the Most Holy Trinity, and with one another. Besides being true food for eternal life, the Holy Eucharist is both a sign and means of unity with God and one another. For the life and unity of the Eucharist to be real and active in our daily lives, we want to heed the urgings of St. Paul in today's Second Reading to "*live in a manner worthy of the call you have received*." We live the life of God we have received, and in which we are lovingly sustained, by remaining faithful to God's holy will and following His Commandments. Our sins



and the sins of others break "the bond of peace," and, therefore, break unity with God and among ourselves. Our "one God and Father of all" desires all of us to be united with Him and with all others. When we are living by the teachings of the Church and worthy of receiving the Holy Eucharist, we are actively living out the unity of our "one faith" and living out the calling of our "one baptism."

Through our attitudes, words, and actions, we want to always show others the joy and beauty of the life we have received in God. St. Paul encourages us, "with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another through love." At times, it can be difficult to "bear with one another through love," especially when others angrily oppose us or obstinately resist living in conformity to the Truth as revealed by God. To love as we are called to love does not mean we endorse or accept the sinful actions or behaviors of others, but we always need to show kindness and gentleness in every circumstance. We should be patient and never be harsh or mean with anyone because these reactions do not serve to build up unity. Through the intercession of our Blessed Mother and St. Patrick, we give thanks to Almighty God for the grace we receive in the Bread of Life, the Holy Eucharist, to help us be continually transformed into the image of Jesus Christ, and thus grow in real unity with God and one another. We become what we eat!

#### FEEDING THE WORLD

With today's two accounts of feeding miracles and the psalm response about the Lord's hand feeding us, it is easy to gloss over the marvelous hymn in Ephesians. It is built around the most potent biblical numbers: one, three, and seven. The core of it is the word "one" expressed seven times. Three of these describe the church: one body, one Spirit, one hope; the next three are the foundations of the church: one Lord [Jesus], one faith, one baptism. All of these are bound up together in the one Father of all. While we might feel daunted by the prospect of duplicating the wonders worked by Elisha and Jesus in the feeding of multitudes, Ephesians gives us a more realistic way to live and "feed" others as the church: by living in humility and gentleness, by acting with patience, bearing with each other in love, and always seeking and striving to preserve unity through peace. Who among us cannot increase the way we "feed" the church and the world by living this way? We are always called upon to "feed" the world in the literal sense; but our mission as church tells us that others are also fed by the way we live and act each moment of each day.
