WELCOME TO ST. PATRICK'S CATHOLIC CHURCH

Father Sam's Message

The Gospel this week is special to me in my own vocation journey as a priest. During my ten years of seminary formation to become a priest, there were a few times when things got really tough, and I thought about leaving. But, when those thoughts came, I would think almost immediately of St. Peter's response in today's Gospel - *"Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life."* By the counsel of the Holy Spirit and the light of Faith, I realized in these moments of discouragement and weakness that there is truly no other place on earth nor any other person to whom I could go to in order to have the deepest needs of my heart fulfilled. We can only find our true happiness, eternal life, when we follow the Lord's Holy Will for us and abandon ourselves to Him.

In the Gospel when our Lord Jesus clearly and repeatedly tells His audience they must "eat His Flesh and drink His Blood," most could not accept what He was telling them. To them, Jesus

was asking to believe in the impossible. They said, "This saying is hard; who can accept it?" They were not able to trust our Lord and let go of their own thinking, preferences, or opinions. Sadly, the response was to leave Him and return to their old lives. This event, at which "many of His disciples returned to their former way of life and no longer accompanied Him," shows us we too could be challenged in our trust of Christ. At some point, we will likely face obstacles that seem impossible to overcome in trying to follow the path God has chosen for us. We also could be resistant and even "shocked" by what He teaches us through His Church. There are times we may feel what God is asking of us is just too much to take. For all of us who have, at some time, been tempted to leave the path on which our Lord has called us, we are reminded that there is nothing better, nothing more assured of making us happy and receiving eternal life, than to follow His will even when we don't understand or are even "shocked" by what He is asking of us. It is very probable Peter was just as "shocked" as the rest of those who heard our Lord's teaching. Although at the time they may have not understood what Jesus was saying, Peter, and the other 11 Apostles who remained, still trusted that whatever Jesus was asking them to believe was true and necessary for eternal life. In my own experience, I am very happy I decided to continue to follow the Lord's will. I am so blessed to be a priest and to be serving here at our wonderful parish.

In addition to our struggle to be true to our vocation and all the teachings of Christ as faithfully declared in the teachings of the Church, the notion of staying with the Lord no matter what happens can apply in those situations where we are offended or hurt by others in a parish setting. Within any parish family, there are some people who have been offended or hurt because of what was said or done to them. In any group of people, including the closest of families, there is the possibility of taking offense at the words or actions of others. There are different levels of understanding, different personalities, and different life experiences that can lead to conflicts and result in hurtful feelings. Although we should always try to be kind, gentle, and merciful as our Lord has commanded

us, there are times we may fail due to our weakness and sinfulness. In the most welcoming of parishes, in spite of our best efforts and intentions, it is possible that a person is treated without compassion and hurtful words are rashly uttered. Nonetheless, any offense received should never be a reason for a person to separate themselves from Christ and His

Body, His Bride, the Church. If someone offends us in the parish, including the priest, and we feel like reacting by leaving the Catholic Church or no longer attending Mass, we can think about these words, "To whom shall we go Lord? You have the words of eternal life." There is no other place or worship community to go in order to truly receive the Bread of Life, to eat the Body and drink the Blood of Christ. Only in the Catholic Church will we find the true Presence of Christ, the Son of the living God, in the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist!

A bit of sad news to report - Pat Fernandez has decided it is now time for her to retire from volunteering as a receptionist. She has faithfully served our parish as a volunteer for over 20 years. Pat currently lives in La Grange and has made the commute every Monday to the office in Sonora. On behalf of the entire parish, I want to extend a heartfelt thank you to her for her many years of dedicated service. We will certainly miss her very much! She has such a vast knowledge of parish history, including knowing most if not all the old-time parish families. We continue to keep her in our prayers.

Let us pray with the intercession of the Virgin Mary and St. Patrick to never leave or abandon our Lord, especially when things get tough, but to continue to choose to trust Him and abandon ourselves to His Will for us.

An Autumn Message About Child Protection

Autumn means back to school for children and back to work for those who have been on vacation. Amidst the hustle and bustle of this season, let us all keep sight of the importance of keeping our children and young people safe from danger.

Training requirements to safeguard children have been established in parishes throughout the Diocese of Stockton. These training requirements help ensure that all children and youth experience a safe environment in all parish activities and events.

The Diocese of Stockton mandates that all people who work with children and youth in our parishes and schools must undergo child abuse prevention training through the guidelines established by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. This training includes being fingerprinted and background checked and completing an on-line training course entitled Shield the Vulnerable. If you are planning on helping or assisting in your child's school, you are required to complete this training.


