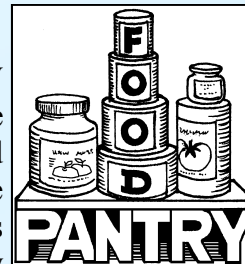


**WHITE CHRISTMAS**

1 listopada Kościół katolicki uroczyście świętuje Wszystkich Świętych Msza Święta o godzinie 10:30 i wieczorem o 6:00, 2 listopada Dzień Zaduszny Msza Święta o 10:30 i wieczorem o 6:30



Uroczystość Wszystkich Świętych nie jest - wbrew spotykanym niekiedy opiniom - "Świętem Zmarłych". **1 listopada** Kościół cieszy się z faktu, iż bardzo wielu zmarłych przebywa u Boga w niebie. W odróżnieniu od tej uroczystości, następnego dnia - **2 listopada** - wspomina się wszystkich wiernych zmarłych. Jest to dzień modlitwy za tych, którzy w czyśćcu przygotowują się do chwały nieba.

**Uroczystość Wszystkich Świętych** jest jednym z najbardziej radosnych dni dla chrześcijan. W ciągu roku niemal każdego dnia przypada wspomnienie jednego lub kilku świętych znanych z imienia. Jednak ich liczba jest znacznie większa. Wiele osób doszło do świętości w zupełnym ukryciu. 1 listopada Kościół oddaje chwałę wszystkim świętym, tym oficjalnie uznanym i tym nieznanym z imienia. Dzień 1 listopada przypomina prawdę o powszechnym powołaniu do świętości. Każdy z wierzących, niezależnie od konkretnej drogi życia: powołania do małżeństwa, do kapłaństwa czy zakonu, do

życia w samotności, jest powołany do świętości. Razem jednak Dzień Wszystkich Świętych i Dzień Zaduszny przypominają prawdę o wspólnotności Kościoła, obejmującej świętych w niebie, pokutujących w czyśćcu i żyjących jeszcze na ziemi. Wśród tych trzech stanów Kościoła dokonuje się, poprzez modlitwę, pamięć czy ofiarę, ciągła wymiana dóbr duchowych. W tej łączności (komunii) wyraża się świętych obcowanie. W **Dzień Zaduszny** tradycją jest chodzenie na groby bliskich, palenie zniczy, modlitwy i odprawianie mszy w intencji zmarłych. Dzień Zaduszny jest dniem modlitw za ludzi zmarłych, których dusze oczekują w czyśćcu na ostateczne spotkanie z Bogiem. Zaduszki są wspomnieniem zmarłych potrzebujących jeszcze oczyszczenia, które mogą uzyskać przez modlitwę wiernych i Kościoła. Jest to dzień nabożeństw i modłów w intencji wszystkich zmarłych, a zwłaszcza dusz odbywających jeszcze pokutę. Temu celowi służą m.in. ofiary składane w kościołach i na cmentarzach. Są to tzw. wypominki za naszych najbliższych zmarłych, by cały Kościół modlił się za ich zbawienie. Z ambon lub przy ołtarzu odczytuje się imiona zmarłych wypisanych na kartkach i odmawia zwyczajowe modlitwy za wszystkich zmarłych. Wiedząc że tutaj nie można palić świec na cmentarzu, zachęcamy by zakupić świece w zakrystii, podpisać je imieniem zmarłego i zapalić przed ołtarzem.
