



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Our Easter celebration falls on April 1st this year. For some people, it is April Fool's Day. But for disciples of Jesus, it is the day of Resurrection. We might appear foolish as we profess our belief that someone can rise from the dead. But it was St. Paul who told us to be fools for Christ's sake. Since God's ways and thoughts are not our ways and thoughts, those who think and act like God are likely to appear fools or clowns. Yet we stand in faith and proclaim, "Christ is risen. Indeed He is risen!"

The foolishness of following Christ doesn't end with such a proclamation. As followers of Jesus, we profess our faith in a God who never stops loving us. This is the God of whom St. John speaks of in the third chapter of his Gospel, "For God so loved the world that He gave his only begotten Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life."

WOW! What a God!

Let us be fools for Christ!
Let us stand with those who are helpless.
Let us stand with the outcast and stranger.
Let us stand with the refugee and immigrant.
Let us stand with those persecuted for their faith.
Let us stand with the outcast and marginalized.

Our God can be found in the most unusual places and in the faces of those we least expect.

Our God is a God of surprises. It is in those surprises that we discover new ways of being God's beloved daughter and son.

In the face of declining numbers of Clergy and Religious, our parish family stands as a vibrant reminder that God is moving in wonderful ways. As we continue to dream of an addition to our Church building, we are reminded that God is ever faithful and walks with us. This parish can be proud of being fools for Christ. We stand with a host of companions who connect us through the centuries to Jesus. He was the one who preached a message that seemed foolish to the people of his day.

WOW! What a Savior!

So today, enjoy being a fool for Christ. Love without limit. And see in each face, the face of Christ, risen from the dead.

The majority were transitioned to self-sufficiency, moving into permanent housing with sufficient income and resources to sustain their families.
