

#### **Permanent Deacons**

The diocese is beginning another Permanent Deacon class this spring for men between the ages of 35 and 59. A deacon is not a mini-priest. Diaconate is an ancient order and ministry of its own. Deacons are called to embody the image of Christ the servant; they represent the church in the community, and at liturgy they bring the needs of the community to the attention of the church. 5th Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: Deuteronomy 18: 15-20
The Book of Job is a long parable which grapples with why bad things happen to good people. This was especially crucial to people then because they didn't believe in life after death, and so one received reward or punishment in this life. Job lost his children, property and health, and lives at the city dump. Here, he gives an understandably pessimistic evaluation of life.

Second Reading: 1 Cor. 9: 16–23 Paul's enemies often criticized him for the least little thing. At When most teachers received compensation from those they instructed, Paul was criticized because he refused support from the community. So, they discred-ited him as not being a legitimate apostle. Here is his response.


