

Habakkuk 1:2-2:4; 2 Tim 1:6-14; Luke 17:5-10

Wisdom and Service in Scripture

- Habakkuk begins his prophecy with a complaint The cruelty of the people overwhelm God.who seems to be silent in the face of these atrocities. God's answer to the Prophet is to wait and trust The will of God is unfurling all around him and exactly in the time God has planned. What wisdom do Habakkuk's words and the divine answer he is given impart to us today?
- Paul writes to Timothy from prison. Many deserted Paul, perhaps fearful that his fate would become their own. Paul encourages Timothy to continue preaching. What does Paul's exhortation to "bear your share of hardship for the gospel" mean in our lives? How can we support Christians throughout the world who risk their lives to proclaim the gospel?
- Jesus informs his disciples that w e are servants of God and recipients of extravagant grace, mercy, and love. How can Jesus' strong, challenging words transform our attitude toward service to our families, communities, and world?
