Remembering this Summer

A few parishioners reviewed the A/C proposals this week. They included refurbishing the present system to creating a more powerful system. The group agreed on a middle proposal. This is a new system with efficiency that would allow it to be smaller and less costly to purchase and to run. At the same time, it could accomodate future planning. For instance, our boiler, like our A/C system is also forty-seven years old. If the boiler would ever have to be replaced, this system would be able to produce heat as well as cooling. The estimate is about \$200,000, which is actually not much more than refurbishing the old system, but less expensive than a new version of what we have now. This is still the proposal stage. Now it's design time. More news to come!

Second Sunday of Advent

First Reading: Isaiah 40:1 - 11

This passage begins with God calling upon the prophet to encour age the Jewish people who are exiled in Babylon. The prophet is to tell them that they will be returning home soon, and the road of the return will pass through the desert. We will also hear God call the people to proclaim from a mountaintop the goodness of God.

Second Reading: 2 Peter 3: 8-14

Our second reading comes at the end of Paul's first letter to the Thessalonians. Just as a parent might give last-minute instructions as their child heads out the door, so Paul has a list of last-min ute instructions for these people whom he loves.
