#### **New Law about Adoption Privacy**

A new law that allow sadoptees and certain others to obtain names of birth parents begins January 1,2017. Birth parents who wish to preserve privacy must submit a Redaction Request Form to NJ Dept. of Health by Dec. 31,2016. The Redaction Request Form can be downloaded at <a href="http://ni.gov/health/forms/reg-36c.pdf">http://ni.gov/health/forms/reg-36c.pdf</a>. Without filing this form, birth parents' names and other information could be given to the adoptee.







First Reading: Numbers 11:25-29

The book of Numbers describes the wanderings of the Jewish people in the Sinai Desert. Earlier in the book, Moses had complained to God about the difficulties of governing so many people. In response, God had directed Moses to gather 70 elders around the meeting tent to receive a share in the administrative burdens. Today's passage picks it up from there.

Second Reading: James 5:1-6

Today we conclude our series of five readings from the letter of James. A major concern in this letter is social justice. Today, the author delivers a blistering attack, reminiscent of some of the Old Testament prophets.

- Has following God's call ever resulted in people scorning you or reacting with jealousy, hatred, or violence? When faced with such evil, how can we cultivate peace?
- The Gospel reading tells us that Jesus' disciples did not understand what Jesus was trying to teach them and that they were afraid to question him. Do you ever feel like you don't understand what God is trying to tell you? Have you ever been afraid to ask God for something? Why?
- What does it mean in today's world to be a servant of all? Who are the ones God calls us to wrap in our arms like Jesus holds the little child in the Gospel?
- We have been hearing about servants the past two weeks. What are your overall thoughts on these past two weeks of readings?

### The last will be first

"Will you let me be your servant? Let me be as Christ to you." The Richard Gillard hymn with this line has become familiar to many Catholics. Sung at funerals, weddings, Holy Thursday foot washings, and Sunday Mass, the lyrics touch human hearts in their eloquent call to humbly serve the needs of others. Pope Francis, who serves the poor in his every word and deed, calls us to share in this journey. How can I surrender my need for recognition? How can I serve the needs of others?

Today's readings: Wisdom 2:12, 17-20; James 3:16-4:3; Mark 9:30-37 (<u>134</u>). "They had been arguing about who was the most important."

# MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 21 FEAST OF MATTHEW, APOSTLE AND EVANGELIST Guess who came to dinner

The names of the apostles are integral to our story of faith, but in truth, we know very little about many of them. Bits of information from the gospels and Acts of the Apostles do allow a glimpse of their lives in the first Christian community. The rest we can only prayerfully imagine. We know that Matthew collected from his Jewish kin the hated Roman tax and that he associated with other tax collectors and "sinners." What we can prayerfully imagine is Jesus sharing a meal with them, and then we might wonder if we would have joined them at table.

Today's readings: Ephesians 4:1-7, 11-13; Matthew 9:9-13 (643). "I have come to call not the self-righteous."

# Tuesday, September 22 Finding new roads

"Instead of being just a church that welcomes and receives by keeping the doors open, let us try also to be a church that finds new roads, that is able to step outside itself," Pope Francis said in 2013. "Go to those who do not attend Mass, to those who have quit or are indifferent." Discipleship requires reaching out beyond yourself or those you know; being church means encountering others where they are—welcoming, listening, and creating a family of worship that expands far beyond the walls of our comfort zone.

Today's readings: Ezra 6:7-8, 12b, 14-20; Luke 8:19-21 (450). "My mother and my brothers are those who hear the word of God and act on it."

# Wednesday, September 23 Feast of Pius of Pietrelcina, priest Marked for holiness

Padre Pio epitomizes the idea of a saint whose life was marked by heavenly signs. Of the more than 300 stigmatists—persons whose bodies carry marks resembling the wounds of the crucified Christ—in the history of the church, Pio was the only priest to be so honored. His reputed miraculous signs included exuding a fragrance not compatible with five fresh wounds; bilocation; prophecy; the power of conversion; and the ability to read hearts. But to Pio himself, his dearest accomplishment was establishing a hospital for the relief of suffering. Looking like a saint may be appealing. Acting like a saint is better!

TODAY'S READINGS: Ezra 9:5-9; Luke 9:1-6 (451). "Jesus . . . gave them power and authority over all demons and to cure diseases."

# THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 24 Full of holes

Carry your wealth in a bag full of holes and your fortunes will change. So the prophet Haggai observes. Today on the Muslim Feast of the Sacrifice, Muslims recall an ancient ritual full of holes: child sacrifice as a means of proving loyalty to God. Abraham brings his son Ishmael (not Isaac in the Quran version) to Mt. Moriah to demonstrate his fidelity. As in the familiar Bible story, the sacrifice is replaced and the son goes free. Heaven values the life of every child.

TODAY'S READINGS: Haggai 1:1-8; Luke 9:7-9 (452). "And whoever earned wages earned them for a bag with holes in it."

# FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 25 The where of prayer

Place is important to prayer. "Where does prayer come from?" the Catechism of the Catholic Church asks (2562). You can pray anywhere, but pay attention to where it is that you are able to be most fully present to God. After all, prayer doesn't come to us, we come to prayer. In prayer, you offer your whole self. "Whether prayer is expressed in words or gestures, it is the whole (person) who prays," the Catechism continues. Open your heart in and to prayer. God is waiting there; you just need to show up.

TODAY'S READINGS: Haggai 2:1-9; Luke 9:18-22 (453). "I will fill this house with glory . . . in this place I will give you peace."

#### SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 26

### FEAST OF COSMAS AND DAMIAN, MARTYRS Heal what is broken

We have only legend for these twin brothers from early church history: They were healers born in what is modern-day Syria who, despite their skill and popularity, never accepted payment for their ministry and died as martyrs. Even if we know few "facts" about them, the human need for healing keeps their story alive. Nearly a thousand years later, Francis of Assisi rebuilt a little church dedicated to Saint Damian that had fallen into ruin and there heard the icon of the crucified Christ instruct him also to rebuild the Church with a capital C. Healing, rebuilding, restoring. What wound can you salve today? What broken relationship can you rebuild?

Today's readings: Zechariah 2:5-9, 14-15a; Luke 9:43b-45 (454). "Pay attention to what I am telling you."
