
MISSION STATEMENT

FROM THE PASTOR ...

For most of us, Christmas is long behind us. We have taken down our Christmas trees and ornaments, the bowl games are over, except for the championship game on Monday night, and our youth returned to school this past week. So how is it that we are still celebrating the Christmas season this weekend? It is because according to the Church the Christmas season does not officially end until we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord, which is this weekend.

Today's feast marks the transition from Christmas back to Ordinary Time. As we return to Ordinary Time, we move from the events surrounding the childhood of Jesus toward the start of his public ministry. The baptism of the Lord was a powerful moment in his life. Jesus did not need to be baptized because of his sins, but we do. Jesus was baptized so that the whole world could see that the promised Messiah had finally arrived in human history. We can only imagine the look of amazement on John the Baptist's face as he witnessed this great and powerful event.

Just as the voice of God the Father announces that his favor rests upon his Son, so too, the Father's favor and mercy rests upon when we are baptized. God's love and mercy is one of the most powerful blessings we will receive in our lives. In this Jubilee Year of Mercy, as we recall and celebrate the many ways that God's mercy is given to us, we should continually ask ourselves three questions: 1. What is mercy? (Pope Francis states that it is God's forbearance not to punish us for our sins.) 2. How have I experienced God's mercy? 3. How can I share mercy with others?

Let us be thankful that God's mercy has been given to us in our baptism. At the same time, we should strive to live and share mercy with others. May the Jubilee Year of Mercy aid us in our efforts to make our world a more merciful place to live. Thank God for the gift of his

Laudato Si' Encyclical —

The Good News People present sections from the concluding chapters of Pope Francis's encyclical, **Laudato Si** (Praise Be to You).

When we speak of the "environment," what we really mean is a relationship existing between nature and the society which lives in it. Nature cannot be regarded as something separate from ourselves or a mere setting in which



we live. We are part of nature, included in it and thus in constant interaction with it. It is essential to seek comprehensive solutions to pollution which consider the interactions within natural systems themselves and with social systems. We are faced not with two separate crises, one environmental and the other social, but rather with one complex crisis which is both social and environmental. Strategies for a solution demand an integrated approach to combating poverty, restoring dignity to the excluded and at the same time protecting nature. (Paragraph 139)

Jubilee Year of Mercy — In recognition of this Jubilee Year of Mercy declared by Pope Francis, we have added another box to our weekly bulletin. We will include in this box a statement and question that comes from the pope's Bull of Indiction entitled "Misericordiae Vultus" (meaning "The Face of Mercy"). A bull is a common name given to certain important decrees issued by the Holy Father. The name comes from the Latin bulla (seal) since a lead or waxen seal was affixed to the decrees to authenticate them. This bull is the fundamental document of the Holy Year that outlines the overall spirit and intention for the Jubilee, as well as the spiritual fruits that are hoped to be gained. The bull opens with the declaration, "Jesus is the face of the Father's mercy. These words might well sum up the mystery of the Christian faith." The logo is the official logo for the Jubilee Year of Mercy.

She attended a class on cake decoration given by Unbound and now has a good business.
