Laudato Si´ Encyclical —

The Good News People present sections from the concluding chapters of Pope Francis's encyclical, **Laudato Si**['] (Praise Be to You).

Each organism, as a creature of God, is good and admirable in itself; the same is true of the harmonious ensemble of organisms existing in a defined space and functioning as a system. Although we are often not

aware of it, we depend on these larger systems for our own existence. We need only recall how ecosystems interact in dispersing carbon dioxide, purifying water, controlling illnesses and epidemics, forming soil, breaking down waste, and in many other ways which we overlook or simply do not know about. Once they become conscious of this, many people realize that we live and act on the basis of a reality which has previously been given to us, which precedes our existence and our abilities. So, when we speak of "sustainable use," consideration must always be given to each ecosystem's regenerative ability in its different areas and aspects. (Par. 140)
