FROM AN ARTICLE BY BISHOP PATES . . .

Jubilee Year of Mercy December 8, 2015 — November 20, 2016

Pope Saint John XXIII — December 8 marked the 50th anniversary of the conclusion of the Second Vatican Council, one of the most significant events in the 2000 year history of the Catholic Church. At the opening session of the council in 1961, Pope John XXIII, who called the council, stated this about mercy, "Now the Bride of Christ wishes to use the medicine of mercy rather than taking up arms of severity. . . The Catholic Church, as she holds high the torch of Catholic truth at this Ecumenical Council, wants to show herself a loving mother to all; patient, kind, moved by compassion and goodness toward her separated children."

Pope Francis — sees this vision accomplished in the Church's exercise of mercy. In so doing, she is revealing the face of Jesus to the world. In the papal letter introducing the Jubilee of Mercy in the first paragraph he boldly proclaims, "Jesus Christ is the face of the Father's mercy. These words might well sum up the mystery of the Christian faith. Mercy has become living and visible in Jesus of Nazareth, reaching it culmination in him. The Father, 'rich in mercy' (Ephesians 2:4), after having revealed his name to Moses as 'a God merciful and gracious, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness' (Exodus 34:6), has never ceased to show, in various ways throughout history, his divine nature. In the 'fullness of time' (Galatians 4:4), when everything had been arranged according to his plan of salvation, he sent his only Son into the world, born of the Virgin Mary, to reveal his love for us in a definitive way. Whoever sees Jesus sees the Father (John 14:9). Jesus of Nazareth, by his words, his actions, and his entire person reveals the mercy of God."

Pope Francis wants each person to realize God's mercy in all its fullness and wants to convey that God's mercy is accessible to all no matter their current circumstances. We can pray like the psalmist with confidence in God's mercy, "Hear my voice, Lord, when I call; have mercy on me and answer me." (Psalm 27:7)


Laudato Si' Encyclical —

Ecology also involves protecting the cultural treasures of humanity in the broadest sense. It calls for greater attention to local cultures when studying environmental problems. Culture is more than what we have inherited from the past; it is also, and above all, a living, dynamic and

participatory present reality, which cannot be excluded as we rethink the relationship between human beings and the environment. There is a need to respect the rights of people and cultures, and to appreciate that the development of a social group presupposes a historical process which takes place within a cultural context and demands the constant and active involvement of local people from within their proper culture. Nor can the notion of the quality of life be imposed from without, for quality of life must be understood within the world of symbols and customs proper to each human group. (Paragraphs 143-144)
