In the gospel this weekend, we see that the disciples are back at the Sea of Galilee in the place where they met Jesus for the very first time. They have returned to fishing, but there is a difference in these men. This time they recognize Jesus, and they obediently follow his advice and are capable of catching 153 fish. When they come to shore, they join Jesus for a meal.

After this meal, we hear the great commissioning of Peter to shepherd Jesus' flock, that is the Church. Not once, but three times Jesus asked Peter, "Do you love me?" Then Peter responds, "Yes, Lord, I love you." Peter is hurt that Jesus asks this question three times, but it is in asking this question that Jesus gently reminds Peter of the three times he denied the Lord. By those three questions, Jesus is letting Peter know that this denial is now completely forgiven. Jesus wants Peter and the rest of the disciples to leave Galilee and begin the work of "catching" human beings in the net of faith, the Church!

Laudato Si´ Encyclical —

The Good News People present sections from the concluding chapters of Pope Francis's encyclical, **Laudato Si**' (Praise Be to You). The encyclical is subtitled, *On Care for Our Common Home.*

It is essential to show special care for indigenous communities and their cultural traditions. They are not merely one minority among others, but should be the principal dialogue partners, especially when large projects affecting their land are proposed. For them, land is not a commodity but rather a gift from God and from their ancestors who rest there. When they remain on their land, they themselves care for it best. Nevertheless, in various parts of the world, pressure is being put on them to abandon their homeland to make room for agricultural or mining projects which are undertaken without regard or the degradation of nature and culture.
