FROM THE PASTOR . . .

The question being asked of us in the gospel this weekend is, "How committed am I in serving the Lord?" This question gets right to the heart of the matter. Jesus tells his disciples a rather unusual story about a devious manager. This manager gets caught by his rich employer for dissipating (that is stealing) his property. Before he is fired by his rich employer, the manager settles accounts with his employer's debtors by reducing the amount they owed. (What he really is doing is subtracting the amount that he was skimming off the top for himself.) When the rich owner discovers what his devious manager is doing, he turns around and rewards him for his enterprise.

Jesus is not suggesting to his disciples that they be devious or fraudulent in their own business dealings, rather he is telling them that they need to show enterprise and commitment in their dealings with God. He warns them that no servant can serve two masters, God and money. This is our challenge today, especially in a nation as rich as ours. Is God our first priority, or are we more concerned about the pursuit for money? This is a decision we face nearly every day of our lives. Let us choose carefully and wisely.

"Mercy for the Least"

In his native France, Vincent constantly sought out the poor in desperate situations, whom he believed the Lord had called him to care for personally. For this, he is known as "the saint of charity."

Henri Bremond, the great historian of Christian spirituality explained, "It was not love of men that led Vincent to holiness, but rather holiness that made him truly and effectively charitable; it was not the poor who gave him to God, but God, on the contrary, who gave him to the poor."

True charity, in fact, derives from the gaze that never gets distracted, not even for a moment, from its focus on the living, familiar, beloved Jesus.


Vincent himself always insisted: "The main purpose for which God has called us is to love our Lord Jesus Christ. If we depart even slightly from the thought that the poor are members of Jesus Christ, infallibly they will diminish the sweetness and charity within.

Vincent's biographer recounted that the last word he uttered on his deathbed was "Jesus."
