FROM THE PASTOR . . .

I think we should be familiar with the story of the Pharisee and the tax collector at prayer. Both men are praying to God, but they are doing so in quite different ways. The Pharisee prays to God using many words. In fact, he speaks rather boldly to God. On the other hand, the tax collector uses prayer as an opportunity to allow the presence of God to touch his life. The Pharisee prays from his pride, and because of this disposition, God can not touch his heart. Where as the tax collector offers ample room for humility, and God can freely enter his heart and touch his life.

This dynamic of interaction with the Lord in prayer is one of receiving from the Lord through our openness and then giving back to others through the working of the Holy Spirit. Prayer is the journey from our human reality to God's truth, and this does require humility on our part. It is through the Holy Spirit that we are able to grow in maturity, that we can become more humble. The example of the Pharisee reminds us that we need to reject the temptation of making ourselves the center of attention in all of our prayers.

Jubilee Year Of Mercy —

In the <u>Joy of the Gospel</u>, Pope Francis calls each one of us to be a disciple to share our faith by what we do and what we say. He says, "This sharing of our faith is always respectful and gentle. The first step is personal dialogue, when the other person speaks and shares his and her joys, hopes and concerns for loved ones, or so many other heartfelt needs. Only afterward is it possible to bring up God's words, but always keeping in mind the fundamental message: the personal love of God who became man, who gave himself up for us, who is living and who offers us his salvation and His friendship." The gift of listening to others' needs, wants, and concerns is the first step for we in the church to help renew not only our own lives but the life of the church and the world itself. What would our world be like if we would all listen to others before we give our own two bits worth?



Collections, Collections, Collections — We have a number of extra collections coming in the next two months. Here is the list of the coming collections so that you can plan ahead with your contribution choices.

The Archdiocese of the Military: This collection is taken every three years and was established to provide the Catholic Church's full range of pastoral ministries to those in the United States Armed Forces. Envelopes for this collection will be in the back of church for the next several weeks.

World Mission Sunday: This annual collection goes to the Society for the Propagation of the Faith and supports the young mission dioceses in Africa, Asia, the Pacific Islands, and parts of Latin America and Europe where priests, religious, and lay leaders serve some of the poorest of the poor. These envelopes will also be in the back of church for the next several weeks.

Hurricane Matthew Relief: Bishop Pates has asked for the parishes of our diocese to support the relief efforts in the areas impacted by this hurricane. The funds collected will be used by Catholic Relief Services and Catholic Charities, USA, as they provide aid in the form of water, food, shelter and medical care. As the bishop has suggested, we will have a second collection at the Masses the weekend of October 29-30.

Catholic Campaign For Human Development: This annual collection funds programs in communities in the United States. By giving a hand up, rather than a handout, CCHD helps people living in poverty join together to identify problems, make decisions, find ways to improve lives, and build solidarity in our communities. The goal of CCHD is to break the cycle of poverty in all communities across the country. Envelopes for this collection will be attached to the November 13 bulletin.


Parents — Please remember to let us know if your child will not be in class. Special events are not a night off! Please schedule other activities on Wednesdays that we do not meet.
