FROM THE PASTOR . . .

This weekend, we hear the story of Zacchaeus one of the most familiar and popular readings from the gospels. Zacchaeus very much wanted to see Jesus, but because he was so short in stature he had to climb a tree to achieve his goal. By the same token, because he was a tax collector, he was despised by the people. So it was astounding, that Jesus would call Zacchaeus down from the tree and invite himself to have dinner in his home. By this brave action, Jesus is reaching out to Zacchaeus with love. Zacchaeus's reaction to Jesus is that he wants to change his life.

Because Jesus did not hold Zacchaeus's sins against him, Zacchaeus is able to view everything in his life differently. He is open to changing his whole lifestyle. Jesus showed love to this tax collector, and it profoundly changed him. Jesus wants to do the same for us. We have it in our means as a person to do either one of these dynamics. We can be like Jesus who looks past the short comings of Zacchaeus, or we can be like Zacchaeus and change our lives for the better. Let us open our hearts to the powerful dynamic of repentance and allow it to change our lives as well.

A reminder that this Tuesday, November 1, is the Feast of All Saints, a holy day of obligation. The Mass schedule for this holy day is in the bulletin. Then Wednesday, November 2, is the celebration of All Souls Day. On Wednesday evening, we will celebrate our special Mass of remembrance of the dead at 7:00 pm. Let us celebrate the saints and our deceased loved ones and allow them to intercede for us and our well being.

Growing In Faith?: How do I live repentance in my life?

Jubilee Year Of Mercy -

As we approach All Saints Day and All Souls Days we are reminded of not only our loved ones who have died but also of our commitment to how we live our lives while we are still living.

Quoting from Pope Francis's encyclical, the Joy of the Gospel, he reminds us, "It is no longer possible to claim that religion should be restricted to the private sphere and thus it exists only to prepare souls for heaven. We know that God wants His children to be happy in this world too, even though they are



called to fulfillment in eternity, for He has created 'all things for our enjoyment' (1Tim. 6:17), the enjoyment of everyone. It follows that Christian conversion demands reviewing especially those areas and aspects of life related to the social order and the pursuit of the common good."

Wouldn't it be great if such things as discord, injustice or even discrimination would be replaced by cooperation, living justly, or respecting one another, no matter who they are or where they come from?


