FROM THE PASTOR . . .

We have arrived this weekend to roughly the half-way point of the Advent season. The Third Sunday of Advent is called "Gaudete Sunday" which means "praise" and "rejoicing". As we come closer to the day of the birth of our Savior, the church reminds us that we are to be filled with a spirit of praising and rejoicing in God for his love for us. In the gospel this weekend, John the Baptist tells the crowd what they should be doing to make ready for the coming of the Messiah. He simply says, "Give to the poor. Be fair and just in your dealings with others." He reminds the crowd that they need to be content and at peace with God for the coming of God's Kingdom is near at hand.

As we draw even closer to the day of our Lord's coming, we are given more and more opportunities to heed the words of John the Baptist. To be fully able to praise and rejoice in the coming of the Lord, we first need to have our sins be forgiven. The sacrament of Reconciliation is the best way to have our sins be forgiven. This Sunday at 1:00 pm we will have our Advent Communal Penance Service. Let us use well this wonderful means for the forgiveness of our sins. The Messiah was born so that our sins could be forgiven and we could be one in God's love. Through the confession of our sins, may we receive spiritual healing in our lives this Advent season.

Growing In Faith?: What step do I need to take in my life?

Laudato Si´ Encyclical —

The Good News People share from Pope Francis's encyclical, Laudato Si' (Praise Be to You). The encyclical is subtitled, *On Care for Our Common Home.*

These problems are closely linked to a throwaway culture. Our industrial system, at the end of its cycle of production and consumption, has not developed the capacity to absorb and reuse waste and byproducts. We have not yet managed to adopt a circular model of production capable of preserving resources for present and future generations, while limiting as much as possible the use of nonrenewable resources, moderating their consumption, maximizing their efficient use, reusing and recycling them. A serious consideration of this issue would be one way of counteracting the throwaway culture which affects the entire planet. (Paragraph 22)
