
MISSION STATEMENT

Laudato Si´ Encyclical -

The Good News People share from Pope Francis's encyclical, Laudato Si' (Praise Be to You). The encyclical is subtitled, *On Care for Our Common Home.*



It is true that there are other warming factors (such as volcanic activity, variation in the earth's orbit and axis, the solar cycle), yet a number of

scientific studies indicate that most global warming in recent decades is due to the great concentration of greenhouse gases (carbon dioxide, methane, nitrogen oxides) released mainly as a result of human activity. Concentrated in the atmosphere, these gases do not allow the warmth of the sun's rays reflected by the earth to be dispersed in space The problem is aggravated by . . . the intensive use of fossil fuels, which is the heart of the worldwide energy system . . . and changed uses of the soil, principally deforestation for agricultural purposes. (Paragraph 23)


