The other harmful ideological error is found in Christians who find suspect the social engagement of others, seeing it as superficial, worldly, secular, materialistic, communistic or populist. Or they relativize it, as if there are other more important matters, or the only thing that counts in one particular ethical issue or cause that they themselves defend. Our defense of the innocent unborn, for example, needs to be clear, firm and passionate, for at stake is the dignity of a human life, which is always sacred and demands love for each person, regardless of his or her stage of development. Equally sacred, however, are the lives of the poor, those already born, the destitute, the abandoned and the underprivileged, the vulnerable infirm and elderly exposed to covert euthanasia, the victims of human trafficking, new forms of slavery, and every form of rejection. We cannot uphold an ideal of holiness that would ignore injustice in a world where some revel, spend with abandon and live only for the latest consumer goods, even as others look on from afar, living their entire lives in abject poverty.

HOW DO I DRAW ON THE BODY OF CHRIST TO STRENGTHEN ME IN LIVING OUT FAITH EACH DAY?

What comes to mind when you hear the phrase “the Body of Christ”? Is it the Eucharistic species, the consecrated bread? Is it the People of God? Both?

St. Paul talked about the Body of Christ as a way to express the reality of his own conversion experience: dying to sin and rising to new life in Christ. The image of “body” expresses the diversity, the interrelatedness, and the unity of all believers — the Church.

During the Eucharistic Prayer at Mass, the priest asks God the Father to send the Holy Spirit upon the gifts of bread and wine so that they may become for us the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ. The second part of the prayer invokes the Spirit again, asking that all who share in the Body and Blood of Christ be brought together in unity and become one body, one spirit in Christ. These two prayers reflect the insight of the early Church that by partaking in Holy Communion we become what we eat: the Body of Christ.

When we speak of the real presence of Christ in the Mass, oftentimes we narrow it to the Eucharistic species. However, the Church teaches the fourfold presence of Christ in the Eucharist: Christ is present in the assembly (those participating in the Mass); in the person of the priest; in the Word of God (the Scripture readings); and in a special way in the bread and wine that become the Body and Blood of Christ.

BISHOP KELLY HIGH SCHOOL FOUR YEAR SCHOLARSHIP

- Each year the Carley, Mooney, and Colwell Scholarship Committee at Bishop Kelly chooses and awards a four-year scholarship to four–six Catholic incoming freshmen who otherwise would find it difficult to attend Bishop Kelly.
- Scholarship recipients can come from any public or private 8th grade.
