## 23<sup>rd</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year B Theme: The Healing Activity of Our Tord.


A healthy person, who seldom or never needs a physician, finds difficulty in understanding the anguish, frustration, and never-to-be fulfilled desires of the physically handicapped. In primitive societies and prescientific times, the condition of the handicapped was even worse that it is today. There were no rehabilitation programs for them, no wheelchairs or any equipment that gave them at least some relief. Since religious beliefs regarded their misery as related to sin and moral guilt, they were often outcasts for whom nobody cared. We find it altogether natural, therefore, that the writers of the Bible used the wretched situation of the lame, the blind the deaf, the epileptics, and the lepers (all of whom they believed to be in the power of demons) as a figure to describe humankind's alienation from God, and the healing of these people as the sign of God's powerful and caring presence. Ethically speaking we could be handicapped and in need of God's healing and love.

Let us, therefore, pray that the Lord may open our ears to listen to his message of forgiveness and endless love.


24 families & 40 students registered for PSR. If you missed it, please see Bonnie King for a registration form. It's not too late to begin!

## CORRELATORS GROUP NOW MEETING MONTHLY



# Confirmation

Congratulations to the newly confirmed

This Saturday, September 8, we witness 17 youths of our parish being confirmed. We read in Isiah 11:2: The Spirit of the LORD will rest on him—the Spirit of **Wisdom** and of **Understanding**, the Spirit of **Counsel** and of **Might**, the Spirit of the **Knowledge** and **Fear of the LORD.**"

To fully appreciate the meaning and importance of this sacrament, it will be good to go back in time and refresh our minds about how God intervened in time and place by sending Samuel (the prophet) to go Bethlehem and meet with Jesse, the father of David. The Lord said, "There anoint him, for this is he!" Then Samuel, with the horn of oil in hand, anointed him in the midst of his brothers, and from that day on the spirit of the Lord rushed upon David. David was faithful to God's call and filled with wisdom and courage become a great king. He wasn't perfect, of

course, but the spirit of God helped him to use his gifts and talents in God's service. It is not by chance that David become the ancestor of Jesus, the promised messiah. These words of Prophet Isaiah came to pass first on David, but the action of God giving his spirit never stopped, but rather it is been given to us through Jesus Christ.

The spirit of God is fully invested in Christ. On the day of his baptism, the Spirit of God come and rested upon Him. The Spirit of God aided Jesus to fully embrace his mission as revealed in the paschal mystery.

Today by the action of the Bishop laying hands, anointing with the Chrism, and pronouncing with the words "Be sealed with the Gift of the Holy Spirit," Christ pours upon these young men and women the same spirit he had received from his Father. The Holy Spirit empowers them to be witnesses to Christ—to grow into holiness, work for justice and peace, treat others with respect, share time and talents, be healers when conflicts arise, help friends do the right thing. Confirmation completes our baptism and flank us into action after the example of his first disciples: to go and build the Church.

May the Spirit of God fill our hearts, manifest his will, and renew the face of the earth.



# THE PROPER WAY TO RECEIVE HOLY COMMUNION


For the reception of Holy Communion, kneeling remains the universal norm of our Latin Rite. However, standing is permitted by the bishops of most places. When one receives standing, one is required to make a specific act of adoration before receiving the Sacred Host or taking the Precious Blood. In the United States, the bishops have man-

dated a bow of the head as the required act of adoration. A genuflection is discouraged, because of the obvious hazard to other people on line. While waiting for the person in front of you to receive, recollect yourself for a moment and bow your head as a gesture of adoration. Step up when it is your turn. Receiving the Sacred Host on the tongue is the normative way of receiving Holy Communion in the Latin Rite. After saying "Amen" in response to the minister of

Holy Communion, the communicant should open the mouth wide and extend the tongue far enough so that the Sacred Host can be placed upon it without danger of falling. Please note that it is important to extend the tongue, not just open the mouth.

One has the option of receiving in the hand in some places. Communion in the hand is allowed in the United States by decision of the American Bishops. If one is receiving in the hand the following is normative: upon approaching the minister of the Host, extend the hands in the middle of the chest. The left hand is extended, with the right hand under the left in support (left handed persons may wish to place the left hand under the right). In essence, a throne is formed in the sign of an X-cross to receive the Sacred Host. The response of "Amen" is given to the proclamation "The Body of Christ," and the Host is received. The individual should then step to the side and receive the Host carefully and reverently.

THE PROPER WAY TO RECEIVE HOLY COMMUNION (CONTINUED)

It is unseemly to "pop" the Host into the mouth as one walks

away. Remember "Who" you are receiving! Please note that it is never acceptable to put out only one hand due to the danger of dropping the host. Those who do not have the easy use of both hands (or whose hands are not perfectly clean for whatever reason) should receive on the tongue.

It is very important that all understand that one does not have the right to receive Holy Communion as one pleases. One may only receive in the manner dictated by Church Law. Only those practicing Catholics who are in the state of grace may receive Holy Communion. Being in the state of grace means not having knowledge of having committed any mortal sins (missing Mass on Sunday through your own fault is a violation of the Third Commandment and a mortal sin!). Those who are not in the state of grace must first be reconciled to God and the Church by means of the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession) before presenting themselves for Holy Communion.
