

Marriage:


Arrangements must be made with the Pastor at least 6 months in advance. Pre-marriage instructions are required.


Anointing of the Sick: Twice per year for those who are homebound or upon request.

From the Desk of Religious Education, Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

On the surface of today's Gospel, we hear stories of Jesus miraculously healing people. But on second look, we reflect on how Mark pairs these two accounts. The two who were healed were women, thus seen as lesser members of society. Add to that, one would have been virtually dead to the community for twelve years, while suffering from a bleeding disorder that rendered her ritually unclean. Barely treated as a person, she would have had to beg and scavenge for any of her needs. The other had been growing as a member of the community for twelve years, now dead to the community from an illness. Jesus not only rewarded the faith of the individuals in the story, but, as he so often did, reached out to the marginalized and rejected. He did not just heal their physical bodies but reunited them with a living community.

Recently, the church, the news, and the world have been abuzz about Pope Francis' encyclical on the environment, Laudato Si'. How blessed are we to belong to this church, that the world still stops to take notice when the Pope issues a document on morality! This recent encyclical, though unique in its focus on the environment, falls clearly in a long line of social teaching, papal encyclicals, and flows from Biblical foundations. Though I could obviously never begin to do justice to an 80 page document in 350 words, one point he makes resonates with our reading: Jesus saw those in need. He reached out to the poor and responded to their needs. As Francis continually points out in his encyclical, the effects of pollution, loss of biodiversity, rampant consumerism and all of the ways the world negatively impacts the environment disproportionately hurt the poorest members of our world, those whose needs are often neglected or ignored. In the Gospel's healing accounts, we can also hear Jesus calling us to pay attention to those who are pushed aside. In the same way Francis, in his call for worldwide conversion to a more ethical treatment of the environment, reminds us "human life is grounded in three fundamental and closely intertwined relationships: with God, with our neighbor, and with the earth itself" (§66).

From the Catechism of the Catholic Church - "Since it belongs to the supernatural order, grace escapes our experience and cannot be known except by faith. We cannot therefore rely on our feelings in our works to conclude that we are justified and saved. However, according to the Lord's words 'Thus you will know them by their fruits'—reflection on God's blessings in our life and in us and spurs us on to an ever greater faith and an attitude of trustful poverty. "A pleasing illustration of this attitude is found in the reply of St. Joan of Arc to a question posted as a trap by her ecclesiastical judges: 'Asked if she knew that she was in God's grace, she replied: "If I am not, may it please God to put me in it, if I am, may it please God to keep me there,"" (CCC, 2005)
